# Loper wrestling roster lists two former Cowboys

Two former Cowboy wrestlers are keeping their love for the sport alive this season at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

Senior Bryce Abbey placed second at 125 pounds at the Bob Smith Open last Saturday at Busch-Gross Coliseum at Fort Hays State University. Abbey, seeded second, won four straight matches before losing a 3-0 decision to Coleman Scott of Oklahoma State, the No. 1 seed.

Abbey opened the season with a fourth-place finish in the Division I competition at the University of Wyoming Cowboy Open in Laramie. On Nov. 20, he placed fourth in the open division at the Kaufman/Brand Open at the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

Now 11-5 for the season, Abbey was ranked No. 2 at 125 pounds in the NCAA Division II Wrestling

Coaches' Association preseason poll. Last season, Abbey finished 37-5 and placed third at the national championships.

Bryce, a 2001 graduate of Goodland High, is the son of Mike and Lorrie Abbey of Goodland. He is studying exercise science.

Junior Curtis Swager started his third season with the Lopers' at the Cowboy Open, where he lost both his matches. Although listed on the Lopers' roster at 197 pounds,

Swager has been wrestling as a heavyweight (285 pounds).

Swager is now 0-6 for the season after losing both his matches at the Kaufman/Brand and Bob Smith opens.

Curtis, a 2002 graduate of Goodland High, is the son of Harvey and Donna Swager of Goodland. He is majoring in biology and health science.

As a team, the Lopers are ranked third in the association's preseason poll behind Nebraska-Omaha and Augustana College of Sioux Falls, S.D. Fort Hays is ranked No. 5.

Nebraska-Kearney will be the host for a tournament starting at 9 a.m. on Saturday at the Health and Sports Center on the university's campus.

Fort Hays State University is one of the teams expected to participate.

Both the boys and girls basketball teams of Brewster High School won their first-round matches Tuesday at the Sagebrush Shootout in Brewster.

The Bulldogs defeated Decatur Community High of Oberlin 69-55 and will face Idalia High of Colorado at 6 p.m. tonight in Brewster High's south gym. Idalia defeated Cheylin High of Bird City 49-12.

The winner of the Brewster/Idalia game faces the winner of the Rawlins County/Golden Plains game at 6 p.m. Saturday. Rawlins County High of Atwood defeated Stratton High of Colorado 48-38 and Golden Plains High of Rexford

defeated St. Francis 49-20.

The Lady Bulldogs defeated Decatur Community 73-52 and also take on Idalia tonight around 8 p.m. in the south gym, following the boys game. Idalia's girls beat Cheylin 48-23.

The winner of tonight's girls game takes on the winner of the Stratton/Golden Plains game about 8 p.m. Saturday. Stratton defeated Rawlins County 55-31 and Golden Plains beat St. Francis 77-52.

The Brewster Bulldogs are 2-0 for the season. Last Friday, they opened with a 75-28 home victory over the Cougars of Cheylin. Senior Heath Baird led the team with 16

point, followed by junior Jonathan Collett with 13 and junior Karman Selby with 10.

The Lady Bulldogs, also 2-0, defeated Cheylin 68-14 last Friday to open their season. Sophomore Avery Schultz scored 21 points to lead Brewster. Junior Jalyn Reid scored 13 and senior Andrea Horn-e-y added nine points each.

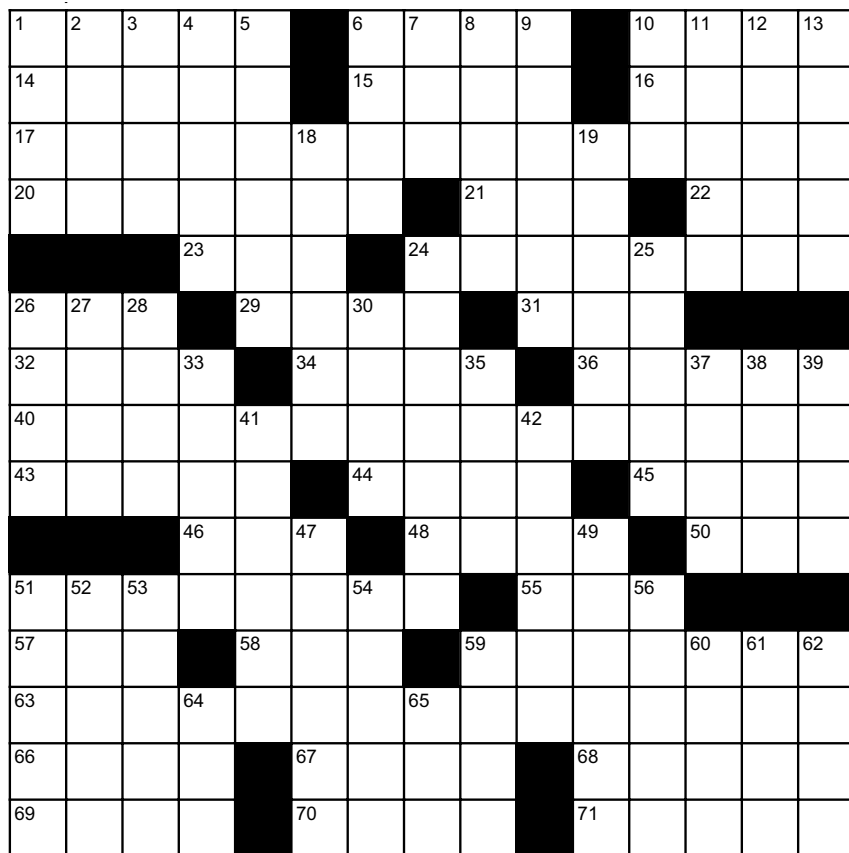
