Senior Bryce Abbey placed second at 125 pounds at the Bob Smith Open last Saturday at Busch-Gross Coliseum at Fort Hays State University. Abbey, seeded second, won four straight matches before losing a 3-0 decision to Coleman Scott of Oklahoma State, the No.1 seed.

Abbey opened the season with a fourth-place finish in the Division I competition at the University of Wyoming Cowboy Open in Laramie. On Nov. 20, he placed fourth in the open division at the Kaufman/ Brand Open at the University of Nebraska at Omaha.
