Scholars do well at Colby meet

The Goodland High Scholars Bowl team placed third at a tournament in Colby on Monday, finishing 6-2 in pool competition.

The team advanced to the semi-finals, where it lost to Colby High School 60-50, then defeated the junior varsity team from Grinnell High 50-40. Scott City won the tournament with Colby High taking second.

Competing in Colby were seniors Mallory Younger and Simon Wang and sophomores Lea Shores, Jena McCall and Michael Smith. In pool play, the team defeated Hill City 60-50, Norton 60-50, Grinnell's junior varsity 80-0, Hays 50-35, Golden

Plains High of Rexford 20-10 and Wallace County High of Sharon Springs 60-25. Goodland lost to Scott City 80-30 and Rawlins County High of Atwood 60-20.

The team finished 1-4 at a tournament in Atwood on Thursday, Dec 2. Competing there along with Wang and Younger were sophomores Cody Engel, Sarah Borneman and Michael Bryce.

Goodland defeated the Rawlins County B team 60-30 and lost to Norton 50-20, Quinter 60-40, Oakley 80-50 and to Decatur Community High of Oberlin 60-40. Oberlin and Oakley advanced to the championship round.

On Nov. 20, seniors Charles Lammers and Jenna McGinley, along with freshmen Robert Borneman and Jonathan McClung, joined Shores for a tournament in Tribune, where they finished 2-3.

Goodland defeated Healy 50-40 and Triplains High of Winona 40-30. The team lost to Leoti 70-40, Cheylin High of Bird City 60-40 and the host Greeley County High 70-30. Greeley County and Leoti went on to the championship round.

The next tournament will be Tuesday, Jan. 4, in Oakley. A week later, the team will have a scrimmage against the staff of *The Goodland Star-News*.

Lady Trojans improve to 10-0

The Colby Community College women's basketball team climbed to 10-0 last weekend at the Jayhawk Shootout in Coffeyville.

Last Friday, the Lady Trojans whipped Highland Community College 96-50 after leading 55-15 at halftime.

Freshman Rita Kollo led the team with 25 points and nine rebounds.

Freshman Suzana Sormaz scored

12 points and sophomore Jayci Stone 11. Freshman Ivy Ramsey, a former Colby High standout, was one of three players scoring eight points for the Trojans.

On Saturday, Colby beat Johnson County Community College 81-66. Kollo again showed the way with 33 points and 10 rebounds.

Stone, a former Goodland Cowgirl, scored 12

points and both Sormaz and freshman Ivana Mijalcevic had 10. Mijalcevic grabbed eight rebounds.

The Lady Trojans continued to receive votes as one of the nation's top teams in this week's poll, released Tuesday by the National Junior College Athletic Association.

The Colby women were to play Thursday at the Lady Cougar Holiday Classic in Scottsbluff, at Western Nebraska Community College, then head to Colorado Springs on Monday for a game against the U.S. Air Force Academy junior varsity.

The Lady Wildcats lost their match Saturday with the Lady Eagles of Eads 57-37. Junior Brandi Bertrand scored 13 points to lead

Wallace County.

Freshman Cricket Short scored nine points, sophomore Bracey Fischer six and sophomore Nikki Welch four. Senior Brodie Williams and sophomore Natalie Elder both scored two, and freshman Kassie Weinland scored a point on a free throw.

The loss evened the girls record at 1-1 for the season. They opened their season last Friday with a 72-22 win over the Lady Vikings of Triplains. Elder led Wallace County with 14 points. Both Williams and senior Sarah Hill scored 13.

The Wildcats are scheduled to play in the Scott City Invitational tournament, which was to have started Thursday and will wrap up on Saturday.

For the first few minutes of Tuesday's game in Burlington, the Cougars gave Goodland a rough time. Once the Cowboys took the lead, though, they kept it, winning 86-70 to boost their record to 2-0 for the season.

Coach Jon McLean said he was pleased with the way the Cowboys played. He said on offense they shot well and did a good job passing, which led to some easy shots. McLean said the defense played well in spurts with some lapses.

Senior Lane Winter scored the game's first two points, but the Cougars scored the next six. Burlington was leading 10-7 when the momentum changed hands.

Junior Jase Herl tied the score at 10 with a three-point basket, then hit two more from long distance to give the Cowboys a 16-10 lead. After Burlington scored on a free throw, Goodland scored the last nine points of the first period, including another three-pointer by Herl, to lead 25-11 going into the second quarter.

In the second, both teams scored

22 points to make it 47-33 at halftime. The third period started with a technical foul called on the Cowboys for not posting the line-up accurately.

The teams continued to play even ball through the third period, with the Cougars outscoring the Cowboys by a point, 18-17. Burlington's Bryant Warren hit a three-pointer as the buzzer sounded to make the score 65-51.

The Cougars attempted a comeback early in the fourth period and closed to within seven points at 67-60. Then Goodland scored the next six points, including four by sophomore Nick Angelos, to lead 73-60.

Trailing 73-62 with about two minutes left on the clock, Burlington made good use of timeouts and fouls to create scoring opportunities, but excellent free throw shooting by the Cowboys down the stretch preserved the win for Goodland. Senior Derrick Raymer, freshman Jance McKee and Herl combined to hit 11 of 15 from the charity stripe.

Herl led the Cowboys with 24 points, followed by Raymer with 19. Herl hit on five of eight shots

from three-point range and Raymer hit on two of four.

Winter scored 12 points and McKee 10. Senior Brock Lohr and Angelos both ended the game with six points. Junior Heath Chatfield both scored five, and senior David Livengood and junior Wyatt Dautel both had two.

Raymer led the team in rebounds with eight followed by Herl with five. Livengood, Lohr and Winter each had four rebounds. McKee grabbed two and Chatfield and Angelos both had one.

The Cowboys C team won 67-48 with freshman Tanner Smith leading the way with 34 points.

The Cowboys were to have played the Weskan Coyotes on Thursday in the first round of the Topside Tip-Off at Max Jones Fieldhouse. They will play at 8 tonight against either Wray High of Colorado or McCook Senior High of Nebraska. Goodland will play a game on Saturday, with the time and opponent depending on tonight's results.

The Cowboys head to Hays on Tuesday to face the Indians. The C team game starts at 4 p.m. (Central Time).
