Two Cowboys earn all-area honors

Goodland senior Derrick Raymer was named one of The Salina Journal's All-Area Top 11 high school football players for 2004.

Another Goodland senior, Brock Lohr, made the Second 11.

"Both Derrick and Brock are very deserving of this honor," said Cowboy football coach Jon McLean.

Raymer played quarterback and linebacker, leading the Cowboys to a 10-2 season which ended in the sectional round of the state Class 4A playoffs. Goodland lost to the eventual runner-up, Rose Hill, in a game Raymer missed due to injury.

As quarterback, Raymer completed 40 of 88 passes for downs. He rushed for 767 yards, scoring 11 touchdowns. On defense, he recorded 59 tackles and intercepted a pass. Raymer was also the team's punter and place-kicker.

Raymer was a first team Northwest Kansas All-League pick as both quarterback and punter, and a second team pick as a linebacker and place-kicker.

Joining Raymer in the Top 11 are seniors Beau Cox of Weskan High

rushed for 1,709 yards and scored 31 touchdowns. The Oakley Plainsmen went 10-2 in Class 2-1A, losing in the sectional round.




