

# Cowboys face undefeated Trojans tonight

The Goodland High School boys basketball team hopes to begin 2005 the way they ended 2004 — with a home court triumph tonight against Stanton County High of Johnson City.

The Cowboys will tip off against the Trojans around 7 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse, depending on the finish of the girls varsity game. Goodland Radio KLOE (730 AM) will broadcast the game live.

“The Trojans are a very good team and have good size and speed,” said Coach Jon McLean.

## Goodland girls seek third straight win against Johnson City

The Goodland High Cowgirls basketball team will be looking to extend its win streak to three tonight against the Lady Trojans of Stanton County High from Johnson City.

The game is expected to tip off around 5:30 p.m. in Max Jones Fieldhouse. It will be broadcast live on Goodland Radio KLOE (730 AM) with the pregame show starting around 5:20.

The Lady Trojans fell to 1-4 for the season after losing to the Lady Larks of Sublette 82-37 on Dec. 17. Loree Siruta led Stanton County with nine points and 11 rebounds.

The Cowgirls are 6-1, winning their first four games before losing to Ottawa High in the championship game of the Topside Tip-Off on Dec. 11. After that, Goodland went on to defeat Hays in a come-from-behind 45-43 contest on Dec. 14 and defeat Quinter 56-31 on Dec. 17.

Leading the Cowgirls scoring attack is sophomore Dani Bedore with 121 points. She has led the team in scoring in six of its seven games, including a 24-point effort on the road against the Lady Cougars of Burlington on Dec. 7.

Sophomore Whitney Archer has 74 points for the season. Junior Justeen Koehler has 68 points and

The Trojans, members of the Hi-Plains League, are 5-0 for the season. In their last game, they had to come from behind in the fourth period to defeat Sublette 57-54 on Dec. 17.

Coach Jason Hajek of Stanton County said his bench was the key to victory as the Trojans were without two of their star players, seniors Andrew German and Ryan McElroy who are expected to be healthy for tonight’s game.

led Goodland with an 18-point performance against Hays.

Sophomore Emily Murray has 32 points so far, sophomore Lindsay Schields 23 and junior Melissa Swager 16. Junior Jordan Frazier has 14 points in six games, but missed the Quinter game because of injury.

Sophomore Kaylee Billinger has 11 points, freshman Samantha Raymereight, sophomore Nicolette Clancy six, senior Whitney Carmichael four and sophomore Stephanie Sheldon two.

Five Cowgirls have either led or shared the lead in rebounds during a game this season. Bedore is the team’s overall leader with 35, having led Goodland twice and shared the lead once. She had a team season-high 11 rebounds against the Lady Longhorns of Imperial, Neb., in the team’s first game.

The Cowgirls will face a tough challenge later this week when the 6-0 Lady Eagles of Colby soar into Max Jones Fieldhouse on Friday for a Northwest Kansas League game. The Eagles defeated St. Francis 70-25 on Dec. 20 and will travel to Hays today for a game against Thomas More Prep-Marian.

The Cowboys defeated Quinter 74-67 on Dec. 17 to set a 6-1 for the first part of the season. Their one loss was to the Hays Indians, a larger Class 5A school, 60-43 on Dec. 14.

Goodland started the season 5-0. The Cowboys beat Chase County High of Imperial, Neb., in the opener on Dec. 3, then four days later beat the Burlington Cougars on the road. On Dec. 9, the Topside Tip-Off tournament filled Max Jones Fieldhouse. The Cowboys

won all three of their games, claiming the championship trophy for the first time since 1997.

Junior Jase Herl leads the team in scoring with 118 points for the first month. He was the high scorer in four of the Cowboys’ seven games, including a 25-point performance against the McCook Bison on Dec. 10 during the second day of the Topside Tip-Off. Herl is Goodland’s leader in assists with 29.

Senior Derrick Raymer was second on the scoring list with 100 points. Although he has not led the

team in any one game, he is the only Cowboy to score in double figures in every one so far. Raymer also is the team’s rebound leader with 62.

Senior Lane Winter has 88 points for the season and led the team in scoring three times this season. He scored a season-high 23 points against the Quinter Bulldogs.

Freshman Jance McKee has scored 37 points so far, while senior Brock Lohr has 35. Junior Heath Chatfield 26 points, sophomore Nick Angelos 10, junior Wyatt Dautel nine and senior David

Livengood six.

“We had very productive Christmas practices,” McLean said. “The Trojans have good size and speed, and if we play well I like our chances. It is a great tune up for Colby on Friday.”

The Cowboys will have home court advantage against the Eagles on Friday when Colby visits Goodland for their Northwest Kansas League game. The teams will meet in a non-league game, in Colby, on Feb. 15.
