

Goodland defends home court tonight

Fans looking for a strong dose of community rivalry can go to Max Jones Fieldhouse tonight for another basketball showdown between the Goodland Cowboys and the Colby Eagles.

Traditionally, Goodland and Colby play two games against each other during the regular season, one home and one away. Only one of these, tonight's, will count as a Northwest Kansas League game. The Cowboys will face the Eagles in Colby on Tuesday, Feb. 15.

Last season Colby defeated the Cowboys all three games they played, twice during the regular season and again in the sub-state tournament.

"Colby will be an exciting game," said Cowboy coach Jon McLean. "They are well coached and Colby/Goodland games are always good ones. It should be a fun way to get things started back up."

The Eagles are 3-3 for the season and are on a two-game win streak. In their last game they defeated the St. Francis Indians 66-29. Colby's scheduled game against Thomas More Prep-Marian on Tuesday in Hays was canceled due to weather.

"They have two very good players in Matt Augustine and Irvin Dinkel," McLean said. "We will need to play well to give ourselves a good chance to win."

Augustine and Dinkel, both seniors, have scored in double-figures in each of their last three games. Against St. Francis, Augustine scored 18 and Dinkel 16.

Against common opponents so far this season, both teams have beaten Burlington and lost to Hays. Goodland is 6-1 for the season.

Leading the Cowboy scoring attack is junior Jase Herl with 118 points, nearly 17 per game. He leads the team in assists with 29 and steals with 17.

Senior Derrick Raymer is Goodland's rebound leader with 62 and leads the Cowboys in blocked shots with 10. He is second on the team in scoring with 100 points, a 14-point average, and in assists with 26.

Senior Lane Winter is second in rebounds with 33 and third in scoring with 88 points. Winter is second in steals with 16.

The starting lineup for all seven games this season has been Herl, Raymer, Winter, senior David

Livengood and senior Brock Lohr. Livengood has scored six points, grabbed 23 rebounds and has 14 steals. Lohr has 35 points, 28 rebounds, eight steals and three blocked shots.

Two other Cowboys, freshman Nick Angelos and junior Heath Chatfield, have seen action in all seven games. Angelos has 10 points, nine rebounds and five steals.

Chatfield has scored 26 points and grabbed 24 rebounds. McLean said Chatfield is recovering from an illness picked up over the Christmas break and is doubtful for tonight's action.

Freshman Jance McKee has seen action in six games scoring 37 points. He is the team's best free throw shooter for the season hitting 19 of 22 attempts for 86 percent.

The next action for the Cowboys will be on Tuesday against the undefeated Trojans of Johnson City. The game was originally scheduled for last Tuesday but was postponed due to weather.

Next Friday, Goodland travels to Atwood to face the Buffaloes of Rawlins County High.

Cowgirls face tough challenge

The Cowgirls face a tough challenge on the hard court tonight, around 5:30 p.m., when the undefeated Lady Eagles of Colby visit Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Colby girls are 6-0 for the season beating each of their opponents by at least 12 points. In their last game before the Christmas break they defeated St. Francis 70-25. Two Eagle players scored in double-figures and two others had nine points. Colby outrebounded the Lady Indians 55 to 29.

Lissa Mazanec leads the team with 92 points for the season closely followed by Emily Sloan with 91. Jessica Stephen has 49 points and

Zanae Baird 40. Mazanec, Sloan and Baird have all led the team in scoring in at least one game.

"Colby has an excellent girls basketball program," said Cowgirl coach Don Smith. "They play a very fast tempo style of basketball both offensively and defensively for an entire game. They return a solid core of players from their state-placing team of last year and are deserving of their high state ranking."

The Lady Eagles finished 23-2 last season losing in the state Class 4A semi-finals to the eventual champion Hayden High of Topeka.

The Cowgirls are 6-1 and on a

two-game win streak. They are led in scoring by sophomore Dani Bedore with 121 points who also is the team's leading rebounder.

Sophomore Whitney Archer is next on the scoring list with 74 points but might only see limited action tonight due to injury. Junior Justeen Koehler has 68 points for the season, sophomore Emily Murray 32 and sophomore Lindsay Schields 23.

The Cowgirls will be without junior Jordan Frazier for the second straight game while she recovers from an injury suffered against Hays on Dec. 14.

Goodland will be home again Tuesday to play the Lady Trojans of Stanton County High School from Johnson City for a game postponed from last Tuesday because of weather.

Football player picked for 2005 Shrine Bowl

Goodland High senior Brock Lohr has been picked to play in the 2005 Kansas Shrine Bowl on August 1 at the Kansas State University football Stadium in Manhattan.

Lohr was one of two players from the Northwest Kansas League selected for the West Team, the other was Oakley's Matt Smith.

"I'm very happy for Brock," said coach Jon McLean. "He worked very hard in the weight room to make himself a good football player. He loves the game and is very deserving of his selection."

As the starting fullback, Lohr was the Cowboys' leading rusher gain-

ing 1,509 yards in 12 games averaging over 125 yards per game. His 24 touchdowns and five two-point conversions made him the team's scoring leader with 154 points.


On the defensive side of the ball Lohr, in his role as linebacker, again proved himself a leader recording 108 tackles including nine resulting in lost yards. He also broke up four passes and recovered a fumble.

Lohr was a first team pick as both running back and linebacker by the Northwest Kansas League.

Goodland's Jordan Bedore, now a freshman at Kansas State University played in last year's game.
