

# Area students get KU scholarships

Two area students received scholarships from the University of Kansas Endowment Association. Shala Marie Hall, a Goodland High School graduate, received two scholarships, and Casey Dean Rhea, a Wallace Community High School graduate, received a scholarship from the association.

Hall is a physical therapy major and received the Cohn Physical

Therapy Scholarship and the Freeman-Roy Scholarship.
