The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys did something Friday they could not do three times last basketball season — beat the Colby Eagles.

In front of a hometown crowd who had just seen the Cowgirls defeat the No. 1-ranked Lady Eagles 65-58, the Cowboys played even ball with the Colby boys until late in the second period. Then they scored the last four points of the half to lead 22-18 going into the locker room.

Goodland led throughout the second half, building the lead to 14 points by the end of the game and winning 57-43.

Senior Lane Winter scored the game's first two points, then the teams exchanged the lead six times, ending the first in a 10-all tie. The teams continued to play even ball through most of the second quarter, tying the score at 12, 14, 16 and 18. A basket by senior Derrick Raymer gave Goodland a two-point lead, and a few seconds later junior Jase Herl scored to make the score 22-18 at the half.

Senior Brock Lohr led the Cowboys in scoring for the first time this season with 14 points. Herl scored 13, Winter 11 and Raymer 10 points. Senior David Livengood scored four, making a basket in the third period that earned a roar from the crowd right after he stole the ball. McKee had three points and junior Heath Chatfield two.

Both Lohr and Raymer had six rebounds to lead Goodland.

## Goodland wrestlers take second in Liberal

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland High School wrestling team finished second at the 23rd annual Southwest Classic in Liberal this weekend, with Cowbovs wrestlers winning two gold and two silver medals.

Sophomore Brett Bahe kept his undefeated season intact by going 3-0 Friday and Saturday, defeating Michael Arellano of Garden City by a 12-2 major decision in the championship match at 112 pounds. Bahe received a first-round bye and pinned his first two opponents in the second period.





Senior Dexter Deeds also remained unbeaten, winning his first three matches by falls, then defeating A.J. Heckel of Ulysses 6-4 in the championship at 135 pounds. Deeds led 3-2 after the first period and 4-2 after the second.

Sophomore Brett Schields faced Zach Kanzenbach of Hays in the championship match at 140 pounds, and he earned a comefrom-behind 7-6 decision over the Cowboy. Schields had a first-round bye and won his next two decisions to earn a spot in the final.

In his match with Kanzenbach, Schields led 2-1 after the first period. Starting in the down position for the second period, Schields scored on a reversal but his opponent then scored on an escape and a takedown to tie the match at 4 going into the third. Kanzenbach, who started in the down position, scored on an escape, then a takedown, to lead 7-4. Schields scored on a reversal with 27 seconds left making the final score 7-6.

Junior Mark Starr won his firstround match by fall and the next two by decision to advance to the finals at 215 pounds against McPherson's Sam Archer. Starting the third in the down position, Starr scored on an escape, then Archer scored on another takedown, winning the match 5-1.

Three Cowboys won bronze medals for placing third in their weight class. At 103 pounds, freshman Jordan Albers won his first match, lost a 3-2 decision, then won his next three, beating Josh Arellano of Garden City 4-0 for third place.

Freshman A.J. Stephens got a first-round bye at 125 pounds, then won in the second before losing to the eventual tournament runnerup. He next defeated Justin Khan of McPherson 9-3, then beat Eric just west of Kansas City. Servin of Garden City 10-3 for third.

He then beat Alex Whitehall of McPherson 8-2, advancing to the third-place match against Denis Fairleigh of Pratt. Cook trailed 2-0 after the first period, 6-2 after the second and was trailing 6-4 when he pinned Fairleigh with 47 seconds left in the third.

Junior Brandon Hatfield placed fifth at 152 pounds, defeating James Gerstberger of Ulysses by major decision 10-1. Three Cowboys placed sixth, freshman Aaron Deeds at 130 pounds, senior Blake Saint at 145 pounds and heavyweight Robert Doxon.

Other Cowboys competing in Liberal were senior Bret Jarmin, who finished the day 3-2 at 171 pounds; freshman Michael Ledesma, 4-2 at 119 pounds; and freshman T.J. Hawkins, 2-4 at 189 pounds. Records include exhibition matches held Sunday morning.

The Garden City Buffaloes won the tournament with 229 points, followed by Goodland with 196. Kapaun-Mt. Carmel High of Wichita was third with 151 points. Sixteen teams participated including schools from New Mexico and Texas.
