

Goodland faces challenge in Colby tourney

The Goodland Cowboys and Cowgirls are hoping to improve on their performance from last year as action begins in the 20th annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic in Colby.

The Cowboys, ranked eighth in Class 4A, opened play Thursday against the Ulysses Tigers (5-3). If they won, they would face the winner of the Liberal vs. McCook game at 3:45 Mountain Time today at the Community Building.

The Cowboys finished sixth in the tournament last year after losing to the Redskins of Liberal 49-43 in

the first round. The next day, the Cowboys defeated Scott City 66-41 in the first round of the consolation bracket. Goodland fell Saturday afternoon to the Tigers of Ulysses 80-54 in its final game of the tournament.

Coach John McLean says he thinks the Orange and Black Classic is going to be a tough tournament. He expected the Ulysses Tigers to be a real test with their quickness and size.

"They know how to handle the ball," McLean said. "They lost to Liberal on Friday, but all their losses have been to very good teams."

"This tournament will solidify

our team and show what we can have for the rest of the season."

If the Cowboys lost to the Tigers, they would face the loser of the Liberal-McCook game at 3:45 p.m. Mountain Time at the Colby High School gym.

On Saturday, if the Cowboys are in the winners bracket, they would play in the championship game at 7 p.m. Mountain Time at the Community Building. If they are in the consolation bracket, they would play for fourth place at 1 p.m. Mountain Time at Colby High. If they lose the game on Friday, they would play for fourth at 3 p.m. Mountain Time at the Community Building, but if

they lost to Ulysses and then lost in the second round they would play for seventh place at 11 a.m. Saturday at the Community Building.

The seventh-ranked Cowgirls face a similarly tough tournament, taking on the Ulysses Lady Tigers (1-8) in the first round.

The Ulysses girls (1-8) got their first win of the season and the first of the past three years last Tuesday, defeating the Scott City Lady Beavers (0-7), 49-31. The Lady Tigers then lost to Liberal on Friday.

Coach Don Smith said he expected Ulysses to be a physical ball club, and that they would not have a lot of finesse. He said the Ulysses

coach is one he has faced for several years.

He expects the Orange and Black to be tough with Ponca City, Okla. in the mix.

Last year, the Cowgirls finished fourth and went 2-1 in the tournament. The Cowgirls lost their first round to the Lady Redskins of Liberal 58-46. The Cowgirls responded by winning their next two games, defeating Ulysses Friday 45-32 and Beloit 57-56 on Saturday.

If the Cowgirls defeated Ulysses Thursday, they will face the winner of the Ponca City-McCook game at 2 p.m. Mountain Time today at the Community Building. If they lost,

the would face the loser at the high school.

The championship game is set for 5 p.m. Mountain Time Saturday at the Community Building. If the girls won on Thursday, but lost on Friday they would play for third place at 3 p.m. Mountain Time at Colby High School.

If the Cowgirls lost on Thursday, but won on Friday, they would play for fourth place at 1 p.m. on Saturday at the Community Building. If the lost both games, they would play for seventh place a 11 a.m. Mountain Time on Saturday at Colby High School.
