

Girls take fifth at Orange and Black Classic

The Cowgirls basketball team went 1-2 and finished fifth at the 20th annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic in Colby.

Goodland started the three-day event with a 53-37 win on Thursday over the Lady Tigers of Ulysses.

The Cowgirls then lost to the Lady Cats of Ponca City 57-53 on Friday and to the Lady Trojans of Beloit 61-45 on Saturday.

The Lady Eagles of Colby won the tournament with a 41-38 win over Ponca City in Saturday's championship at the Colby Community Building. Colby is now 10-2 for the season.



We were a step behind on defense all day and we had the most turnovers of the year.”

Bedore scored 25 points to lead the Cowgirls. Billinger had seven points and junior Justeen Koehler six. Carmichael, junior Melissa Swager and sophomore Emily Murray each scored two, and freshman Samantha Raymer scored on a free throw.

Three Trojan players scored in double figures, led by Krier with 18.

In Goodland's win over Ulysses on Thursday, the Cowgirls used their “defensive intensity” to jump out to a 8-0 lead while keeping the Lady Tigers scoreless during the first three minutes of the opening period.

Goodland dominated Ulysses throughout the game, leading 15-4 after the first period and 31-17 at halftime.

The Cowgirls outscored the Tigers 13-6 in the third to make it 44-23 going into the fourth, where Ulysses managed to outscore Goodland 14-9 to make the final 53-37.

Bedore led Goodland with 11 points, with sophomore Lindsay Schields close behind with 10. Koehler scored nine points, Raymer eight and both Swager and Billinger had four. Junior Megan Rubio scored three points and sophomores Stephanie Sheldon and Alicia Studer both scored two.

Ulysses senior Hope Fry led all scorers with 13 points.

Other first-day action saw Ponca City beat McCook 61-36, Beloit beat Scott City 57-21 and Colby defeat Liberal 63-35.

Against Ponca City on Friday, Bedore scored the game's first four points, however Crystal Moore scored the next five for the Lady Cats, who kept the lead throughout the rest of the game. Bedore got the Cowgirls within one at 11-10 with 27 seconds left in the first period, but the Cats' Brook Hunter hit a three pointer to make it 14-10 as time ran out.

In the second, Goodland again got within one at 18-17 but was outscored 12-4 to make Ponca City's lead 30-21 at halftime.

The Cats continued to hold onto the scoring edge in the third and led 43-31 going into the fourth period.

Senior Whitney Carmichael opened the scoring in the second period with a basket that tied the game at 16.

A short time later, sophomore Dani Bedore was fouled making a basket and with the successful free throw gave Goodland a 19-17 lead.

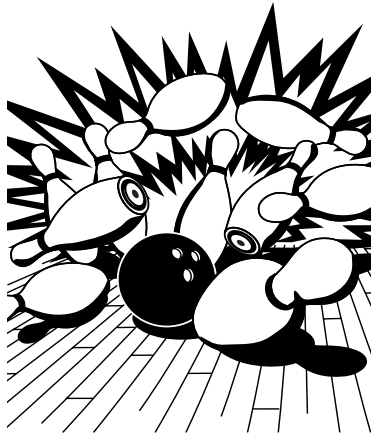
However, Beloit scored the next six points making it 23-19, and the Trojans kept the lead throughout the rest of the game.

Leading 34-24 at halftime, Beloit outscored the Cowgirls 19-7 in the third to make the score 53-31 going into the fourth period. Goodland tried to fight back but could not get any closer than 13 points, losing the game 61-45.

“The game with Beloit was by far our worst outing of the season,” said Cowgirls coach Don Smith. “They were better in every aspect of play.
