

# Experiment station planned instruction for farmers

**January 28, 1905:** NOVEL IDEA — County Experiment Station to Instruct in scientific Farming — Bill to Empower County Commissioners to Act — Would Hasten Development in Successful Farming and Turn the West into Vast Productive Fields — E.W. Albright of Llanos township of Sherman County, now studying agriculture at Kansas Agricultural college at Manhattan, has started an idea that, if adopted, may revolutionize farming in western Kansas and realize for

our people the hope for a golden age of agriculture upon these rich plains. His idea is to establish county experiment stations at county poor farms, under a trained agriculturalist, who shall practically instruct the farmers of the county in the most scientific and successful methods of soil culture, grain breeding and crop production. This bill introduced before the legislature, supported by professors

Goodland, and who has a fine young orchard, during the year raised a number of bushels of apples, from the bearing trees in his orchard. A specimen of that fruit brought to this office shows that the apples which Mr. Warner raises are equal to the best importations and are of an excellent quality — all of which goes to prove that the Sherman county farmer is able, with a little effort and care, to supply himself with fruit. **January 30, 1905:** Representative B.F. Brown of Sherman County last week introduced a house con-

current resolution to submit a proposition to the people to fix the compensation of members of the legislature and to cut out the pass evil. The resolution which will be taken up soon would amend the constitution of the state of Kansas in that the members of the legislature would receive a compensation for their services the sum of \$500 for a regular session and five dollars a day for any special session, but such compensation would not exceed the sum of \$150 for any special session; and three cents a mile for each mile traveled by the usual route going to

and returning from the place of meeting. **January 31, 1905:** Representative Brown of this county introduced a bill in the house exempting counties where infections and contagion among cattle does not exist from livestock district quarantine and directs the governor to make proclamation of such exemption. *From weekly issues of The Goodland News, provided by the Sherman County Historical Society.
