People worship many things, including money, and even idolize athletes and movie stars. But the Bible tells us there is only one true God and that He is the only one we should worship. How can we know who He is?

Can we be sure our worship is directed to Him?

1 Corinthians 8:5, 6 says, "For even though there are those who are called 'gods,' whether in heaven or on earth, just as there are many 'gods' and many 'lords,' there is actually to us one God the Father, out of whom all things are, and we for him; and there is one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things are, and we through him."

When the Bible was written, God's name appeared about 7,000 times in it but has since been replaced with the titles LORD or God.

Why is it important to know that He has a name? Imagine if you wanted to talk to a friend. Would you call for him by name or by his title? If you called out to someone by title in a crowd, would the right person answer?

People usually want others to know and remember their names and call them by name. It can be irritating, if not insulting, to have someone who should know you well forget your name. Why should God feel differently? He had His name recorded in the Bible, so we could know it, not so we could call him LORD.

the earth." John 4:24 says, "God is a spirit," and John 1:18 says, "No man has seen God at any time.'

Do these texts mean we can't know God? Think about it, blind people are able to get to know others, but they can't see anyone. So is it wise to think we can't know God because we can't see Him?




