## St. Francis targeted as Cowgirls 13th win

Tonight the Goodland Cowgirls try to stay undefeated in the Northwest Kansas League when they face the Lady Indians of St. Francis at 5:30 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowgirls, 12-3 overall, are 4-0 in league play having beaten Quinter, Colby, Atwood and Oberlin. League games after tonight include next Friday at Oakley and Friday, Feb. 18, here against Hoxie to finish the regular season.

The Indians are 3-12 overall after defeating Cheylin High of Bird City 54-34 on Tuesday. Amy Grace led St. Francis with 15 points followed by Alecia Zimelman with nine and Lauren Ross with seven. Grace has scored in double-figures in each of the Indians' last four games including an 18-point effort in her team's 62-40 loss to Brewster last Friday.

Cowgirl coach Don Smith said he believed last year's girls roster for St. Francis was senior heavy which cost the Indians a lot of playing experience due to graduation. As a result, he said, Goodland will face a lot of different combinations as St. Francis will try to keep fresh players on the court and make the Cowgirls keep adjusting to different lineups.

The Cowgirls defeated Decatur Community of Oberlin 59-51 last Friday at Max Jones Fieldhouse. Junior Justeen Koehler scored 22

points to lead Goodland for the second time this season. Sophomore Dani Bedore scored 19 points and led the team in rebounds with 13.

Bedore, who led Goodland in scoring in 13 of its 15 games, is averaging over 20 points per game. She is the team's rebound leader with 125. Koehler is averaging over 11 points per game and has 121 rebounds for the season.

Sophomore Whitney Archer, who will miss the rest of the season due to a knee injury, scored 76 points and grabbed 31 rebounds in the first eight games of the season.

Besides Bedore and Koehler, five other Cowgirls have seen action in all 15 games this season. Sophomore Emily Murray has 69 points and 58 rebounds; sophomore Kaylee Billinger 59 points and 34 rebounds; sophomore Lindsay Schields 49 points and 19 rebounds; junior Melissa Swager 32 points and 40 rebounds; and senior Whitney Carmichael 10 points and 25 rebounds.

Goodland travels to Lakin on Tuesday to face the Broncos then on Friday heads to Oakley for a showdown with the Plainsmen.

Lakin finished 19-5 last season losing in the first round of the state Class 3A tournament. The Lady Broncos are now 10-5 overall after beating Satanta High 69-30 on Tuesday in Lakin.

# Cowboys take on Indians in tonight's league contest

The Goodland Cowboys will be defending their home turf tonight when the Indians of St. Francis invades Max Jones Fieldhouse about 7 p.m. for a Northwest Kansas League game.

The Indians enter the game with a 5-9 overall record after defeating Cheylin High of Bird City on Tuesday 59-41. Joel McAtee led St. Francis with 13 points followed by A.J. McAtee and Levi Weeden who both scored nine.

"St. Francis is a better team than their record shows," said coach Jon McLean. "Their kids really work hard and we cannot overlook them. We need to focus and be ready to play."

Goodland, 11-4 overall, takes a 4-0 league record into the game while the Indians are 0-4 in the league.

The Cowboys will be trying to win their second straight game after beating the Red Devils of Oberlin last Friday 72-57. That win broke a three-game losing streak which started on Jan. 21, the second day of the Orange and Black Classic.

McLean said the team is starting to get over the sickness some of the players have been experiencing which "really sapped" the team's energy level.

Senior Derrick Raymer, who has started 14 of 15 games this season, leads the Cowboys in scoring with 210 points averaging 14 per game. Raymer leads the team in rebounds with 106 and in blocked shots with 19.

Junior Jase Herl is next on the

scoring list with 206 points averaging well over 13 per game. He is the team's leading three-point shooter hitting 18 of 68 for 27 percent. Herl leads the Cowboys in steals with 42 and in assists with 69.

Senior Lane Winter has 171 points for the season for an 11-per game average. He is second on the team for steals and blocked shots.

Senior Brock Lohr has 105 points for the season and is second on the team in rebounds. Lohr, Winter, Herl and senior David Livengood have started each game for the Cowboys so far this season. Livengood has 18 points and 41 rebounds.

Freshman Jance McKee, who started against Oberlin last Friday, has 113 points for the season. He leads the team in free throw efficiency hitting 44 of 51 for 86 percent.

Junior Heath Chatfield, who also has seen action in all 15 games, has 55 points and 43 rebounds for the season.

Tipoff for tonight's game will be around 7 p.m. dependent on when the girls varsity game finishes. There will not be a C team game.

The Cowboys travel to Lakin Tuesday to face the Broncos who are 6-8 overall for the season. Lakin, a Class 3A school and a member of the Hi-Plains League, is 7-7 for the season after coming from behind on Tuesday to defeat Satanta 48-47.

"Lakin is a dangerous team," said McLean, "they have good size and quickness. We need to play well on the road as we have been struggling away from the Max."
