**Water Testing** — The Northwest Local Environmental Protection Group does well evaluations, including testing for bacteria and nitrates. To schedule an evaluation or discuss environmental concerns, call the Health Department at 899-4888.

The group charges a \$50 letter of intent fee (similar to a permit) which is good for one year. It is required on the installation or modification of all septic systems in the protection group’s area.

The group will continue to offer free testing to private individuals. However, if you are selling, purchasing or refinancing any property that requires an inspection, the group will charge a \$90 inspection fee. The inspection includes site evaluations on well and septic systems and testing the water. The group will also charge a \$25 fee for child care and foster care inspections.

Albert Fenner

Albert E. Fenner, 79, a World War II veteran and retired Goodland service station owner, died Thursday, Feb. 3, 2005, at St. Anthony Central Hospital in Denver.

He was born June 1, 1925, at Denton, Mont., the son of Elmer H. and Mona Mae (Carl) Fenner. He was affectionately called Junior by his family.

Fenner graduated from Sherman Community High School in 1943. From August of 1943 through January of 1946, he served in the Army.

On Oct. 22, 1949, he married Vola Laurene Gerver in Goodland. He operated Fenner’s Service

Station in Goodland and was known for his big heart and quick wit. His family and community were important to him.

Mr. Fenner was a life member and past commander of the Goodland Veterans of Foreign Wars Post and was bingo chairman for 37 years; a member the Goodland American Legion; a Sherman County volunteer firemen for 17 years; and played on town softball, baseball and basketball teams.

Preceding him in death were his parents; an infant daughter in 1953; a brother, Robert Fenner; and a sister-in-law, Loraine Fenner.

Survivors include his wife; three sons, Steven (Faylene) Fenner of Garden City, Vernon (Sue) Fenner of McPherson and Brian (Joey) Fenner of Hoxie; a daughter, Marlene (Don) Ward of Webb City, Mo.; a brother, Elroy (Lucille) Fenner of Goodland; six grandchild-

ren; and six great-grandchildren.

Services were at 10 a.m. Monday, Feb. 7, 2005, at the Goodland First Christian Church with the Rev. John Park Winkler and Dr. Chet Ross officiating. Burial followed in the Goodland Cemetery.

Eleanor Brown

Eleanor Josephine (Zace) Brown, 95, Goodland, a retired stenographer, died Friday, Feb. 4, 2005, at the Goodland Regional Medical Center.

Mrs. Brown, known as “EZ,” was born Jan.

13, 1910, in Harvey, Ill., the daughter of Minnie (Kunde) and Joseph Henry Zace. Orphaned at the age of 10, she was taken into foster care in Albuquerque, N.M., by John and Mary (Morgan) McCrea. She went to school in Albuquerque and attended the University of New Mexico for one year.

On Sept. 7, 1929, she married Vollie Gholson Brown in Wilkensburg, Pa., where he was an electrical engineer for the Westinghouse Corp. In 1931, the family moved to Albuquerque, where he pursued a career in life and casualty insurance.

During the Great Depression, many household moves were necessary in the insurance field, and Mrs. Brown often told of moving 23 times in the first 25 years she was a wife. She was a homemaker in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Colorado and Kansas.


