

# Goodland boys embarrass Sainty 70-43

Although it took nearly two minutes for them to get on track against the St. Francis Indians on Friday, once they did, the Cowboys went on an express ride to a 70-43 victory.

It was a sluggish start for both teams, with the scored tied at 2 after the first two minutes. Things changed quickly as Goodland then outscored St. Francis 19-4 for a 21-6 first quarter lead. Three Cowboys combined for five three-point baskets. Goodland led 35-22 at halftime, then outscored the Indians 27-9 in the third period to lead 62-31 going into the fourth. Under Northwest Kansas League rules, a continuous clock ran in the fourth quarter as the Cowboys went on to take the game 70-43.

Goodland hit on 46 percent of their shots from the field, including 12 of 25 from three-point range, compared to 31 percent for St. Francis. The Indians hit on just three of 11 from long range. "They gave us plenty of shots from outside because of their zone defense," said coach Jon McLean. The win boosted the Cowboy's record to 12-4 overall and 5-0 in the league. Neither team scored during the opening minute. Indian senior Tanner Kinen scored the first points, then about 40 seconds later, senior Brock Lohr tied the game with a basket.

Junior Jase Herl hit a three, and about a minute later senior Derrick Raymer did the same for an 8-2 Cowboy lead. After Kinen scored his second basket, Goodland went on a 13-point run which included another three pointer by Herl and two by freshman Jance McKee.

Joel McAtee of St. Francis scored the final basket of the period to make it 21-6 going into the second quarter. The Indians fought back and outscored the Cowboys 16-14, but Goodland still held a 13-point

lead at halftime, 35-22. The third period opened with a 12-point run by the Cowboys which included two more three-pointers by Herl. Later, with the score 56-30, another three by McKee gave Good-

land a chance for a 30-point lead. Goodland had three chances but failed to score, then a foul sent McAtee to the charity stripe, where he converted one of two shots to make it 59-31

McKee then took the inbound down the court and hit his fifth three-pointer of the game at the buzzer for a 62-31 Goodland lead.

In the fourth quarter, McLean started to give his bench some varsity playing time as the Cowboys went on to earn their second straight win, 70-43.

McKee scored 19 points to lead the Cowboys for the first time this season. Herl was right behind with 18 and Raymer with 15. Both McKee and Herl hit five three-pointers. Raymer had two.

"It was great to see our guys shoot well from the three-point line," said McLean. "Jase, Jance and Derrick shot it well."

Senior Brock Lohr, junior Heath Chatfield and sophomore Landon Williams all scored four, and both senior Lane Winter and sophomore Nick Angelos scored two.

"I was a little disappointed with our rebounding," said McLean, "we will have to do a better job the rest of the season."

The Indians had the edge in rebounding 32-30. Lohr led the Cowboys with 10 rebounds followed by Raymer with five. Three other players each grabbed three.

McAtee led St. Francis with 11 points, followed by Kinen with 10.

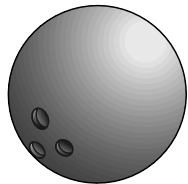
The Cowboys are on the road today as they travel to Lakin to face the 7-8 Broncs who lost on Friday to Stanton County High of Johnson City 67-58.

Lakin is a dangerous team," McLean said, "they have always played us pretty tough at their place. If you leave their perimeter guys open, they can make shots.
