February 11, 1905: Commissioners Fill Vacancy - Fred Barnett, a graduate of the University of Kansas, and a holder of a state certificate, is school superintendent of Sherman County by appointment, by the board of county commissioners to fill the unexpired term, the vacancy occurring through the resignation of John Reed, assistant principal of the Goodland Schools.

Mr. Reed, since he has held his position in the Goodland schools, has been unable to carry out the statute requirements incumbent upon county superintendents, and therefore recently surrendered that office, which was filled by the county commissioners appointing Mr. Barnett, who holds until May.

Mr. Barnett is well qualified for the office, and the commissioners could not have selected a more competent person. It came to him unsought.
