

Man pardoned on assault charge

Sherman County Historical Society
February 25, 1905: Thomas Bandy Pardoned—Thomas Bandy, who was sentenced to the penitentiary at the July term of district court of last year for criminal assault on M. Eversoll, was pardoned unconditionally by Governor Hoch, on the recommendation of the board of pardons.

Some time ago, a petition was circulated asking for his pardon, and a notice of application for pardon was published in this paper.

E.F. Murphy, although he was the prosecutor in the case, interested himself for Bandy and was largely instrumental in securing executive

clemency. The pardon restores him to full citizenship.

February 26, 1905: AD—NEW TAILOR SHOP—I have purchased the building just south of the Wilson Bros. office and am conducting a first class tailor shop, carrying a fine line of spring and summer 1905 samples. Cleaning and pressing done. Call and see me. JOE KOLANCY, Prop.

February 27, 1905: Joe Kolancy is building an addition to the building recently bought on the east side of main street. This is understood as

a temporary improvement. In the spring, he will put up a larger building for a tailor shop and move the small ones back.

February 28, 1905: ‘Dad’ Auer has been confined to his bed for more than a week with rheumatism. His friends miss him, and it is hoped he will be about again soon.

Truck driver dies in accident; services set

The familiar route home for a Goodland truck driver turned out to be his last as an accident on I-70 claimed his life on Friday, Feb. 18.

Jeffrey D. Weaver, 42, a Fed Ex Freight truck driver was found dead at the scene of an accident on I-70 about 3 miles east of Agate, Colo., at 5:31 a.m.

The police report, filed by Trooper Lloyd Beck, Trooper Chris Lamb and Corp. Tim Hilferty, with the Colorado State Patrol, said the Volvo truck-tractor with two semi pup trailers driven by Weaver was headed east when the vehicle drifted off the right side of the highway.

The truck hit a parked and abandoned Plymouth Colt car. The truck went off the right side of the road, hit an embankment, rolled and came to rest facing south on its top. The abandoned car was pushed halfway off the shoulder and came to rest upright and facing east.

Although troopers said Weaver

was dead at the scene, he was taken to the Elbert County Coroner where Dr. Westphal pronounced him dead at 6:14 a.m.

Troopers said he was not wearing a seat belt.

Weaver was born Dec. 10, 1962, at Wichita, the son of Alfred and Martha (McMann) Weaver. On Aug. 31, 2001, he married Ammie Gilkey of Garfield at Cheyenne, Wyo.

Weaver, his wife and daughter, Dylaney Diane, recently moved here because he was transferred from Wichita through Fed Ex.

Preceding him in death were his parents and two brothers, Monty “Butch” Lee and Richard Allen.

Survivors include his wife, and a daughter, Dylaney Diane, of the home; an unborn child; two brothers, Eddie Weaver of Wichita, Brent (Ellen) Weaver of Arlington, Texas; his parents in-law, Dave and Nellie Gilkey of Garfield; and brothers and

sisters in-law.

Memorial services will be at noon Mountain Time Saturday, Feb. 26, at Resthaven Mortuary in Wichita. He was cremated.
