

Forty-one wrestlers qualify for district

Forty-one members of the Goodland Kids Wrestling Club will compete at the district tournament in Dodge City, starting at 8 a.m. (Mountain time) Saturday.

Twelve of the 41 wrestled for the Goodland High School Cowboys this year, including six who qualified for the state Class 4A tournament Feb. 25-26 in Wichita.

The wrestlers qualified for Saturday's meet by placing among the top four in their weight class and age group at the subdistrict tournament last Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

More than 450 wrestlers from 16 cities competed.

The day's activities started with a parade of wrestlers.

A special dedication was made

for long-time Kansas Kids participant Michael Kling, who was killed in an automobile accident on Oct. 24. As part of the dedication, Ron Schilling read a poem he wrote in Michael's honor.

Fifteen Goodland wrestlers won gold medals.

In the 8-and-under-category, Aaron Avelar took first place at 46 pounds, Colton Cooper at 73 pounds and Ian Bonsall at 110

pounds.

At 10 and under, first-place winners were Cy Paxton at 58 pounds, Laine Herl at 120 pounds and Taylen Smith at 150 pounds.

In the 12-and-under group, Seth Miller won the gold at 72 pounds, as did Tim Roeder at 110 pounds.

At 14 and under, first-place winners were Kade Sheldon at 85 pounds, Keegan Smith at 120

pounds, A.J. Stephens at 130 pounds, T.J. Hawkins at 205 pounds, Bobby Doxon at 235 pounds and Casey House at 265 pounds.

Mark Starr won the gold at 245 pounds in 16-and-under.

Twenty members of the Goodland club took home the silver medal for second place.

In 8 and under, they were Issac Walton at 43 pounds, Simon Bassett at 46 pounds, Josh David at 52 pounds, Coy Johnson at 58 pounds, John Peden at 76 pounds, Gabriel Ledesma at 95 pounds and Hiram Hendrich at 110 pounds.

Second-place finishers at 10 and under were Austin Avelar at 64 pounds and Brook Bahe at 76 pounds.

At 12 and under, silver medalists were Nathan Deeds at 115

pounds and David Murray at 165 pounds.

At 14 and under, the second-place finishers were Ryan Taylor at 150 pounds, Fernando Martinez at 165 pounds and Clay Schilling at 235 pounds.

In the 16-and-under category, six Goodland wrestlers took home the silver.

They were Jordan Albers at 110 pounds, Justin Holloway at 125 pounds, Dual Rall at 135 pounds, Brett Schields at 150 pounds, Jon Cook at 165 pounds and Josiah Goodley at 175 pounds.

Others competing at Saturday's tournament in 8 and under were Chase Johnson, fourth at 43 pounds, John Salinas, third at 49 pounds, and Blake Stasser and Kelby Smith, third and fourth respectively at 52

pounds.

Others participating in 14-and-under include Allen Normandin, third at 105 pounds, and Michael Ledesma, third at 110 pounds.

Mikail Freeman, who placed sixth last Saturday at 90 pounds in the 10 and under category, will get to compete at Dodge City because two of the wrestlers finishing ahead of him notified officials they could not attend.

"It was a huge success," said Sandy Miller, one of the secretaries for the Goodland club, "and very well run. We couldn't have done it without all the volunteer help we received. I want to wish the wrestlers competing in Dodge City good luck."

The state tournament will be Mar. 24-26 in Topeka.

Colby Lady Trojans lose final game, 72-58

The Colby Community College women's basketball team ended its season Monday with a 72-58 loss to Labette Community College in the quarterfinals of the Region VI tournament in Salina.

The Lady Cardinals, who led 27-24 at half-time, were more accurate shooting from the field, hitting on 36 percent of their field goals compared to 30 percent for Colby. Labette outrebounded the Trojans 58-40.

The Lady Trojans finished their season 25-7 overall and 11-5 in the Western Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

Freshman Rita Kollo, the Western Division's Most Valuable Player, scored 23 points to lead Colby in scoring against Labette. Kollo was the Trojans' top scorer this season, averaging nearly 20 points per game.

She also led the team in rebounds

with 260, an eight-per-game average, and in steals with 78.

Sophomore Jayci Stone finished her final game as a Lady Trojan with 16 points and a team-high 10 rebounds.

Stone ended the season second on the scoring list averaging more than 13 points per game.

She was third in rebounds with 170 and in steals with 51.

Jayci, the daughter of Dennis and Karen Stone of Goodland, played in all 32 games for Colby this season, scoring a career-high 25 points against Independence Community College on Nov. 20.

A 2003 graduate of Goodland High, she was named to the Northwest Kansas All-League basketball team her junior and senior seasons as a Cowgirl.

Freshman Ivy Ramsey, a former Colby Lady Eagle standout, saw action in 31 games in her first season with the Lady Trojans.

She ended the season with 89 points, going 20-of-26 from the free throw line, and grabbing 48 rebounds.

The Lady Cardinals of Labette lost in Tuesday's semifinals against Seward County Community College, 82-49.

Seward County went on to face Barton County Community College in the tournament's final game Wednesday winning 63-38.

The Lady Saint of Seward County were ranked No. 6 in the final Division I poll by the National Junior College Athletic Association.

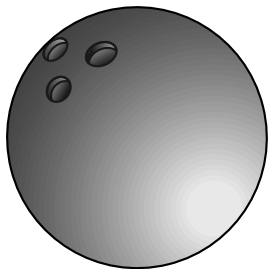
Cowley County Community College was ranked 12th but lost in the quarterfinals Monday to Barton County 59-50.
