The Goodland Star-News The Colby Lady Trojans softball team won three of its four games this weekend during the Colby Classic, finishing the tournament with a 5-1 win over Dodge City Community College on Sunday.

"The team played really well this weekend," said Colby coach Carl Adams. "We had solid pitching and defense. We had players step up and hit the ball all weekend."

Eight teams participated in the tournament, including one from Iowa and one from Nebraska. The games were played at the campus field and the city fields on 9th Street. The teams were scheduled to play two games on Sunday, but the weather and problems with one of the fields cut that to one.

In Colby's contest on Sunday against Dodge City, the game remained a scoreless tie until the bottom of the third inning, when freshman Sheena Hawks started things off by hitting a single to left field. She advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt by sophomore Mary Egger.

Next, freshman Molly Langerak hit a double to left field that scored Hawks and Colby led 1-0. Freshman Danielle Schmidt then hit a single to left, advancing Langerak to third. Schmidt was followed by freshman Heather Ebert, who hit the game's only home run over the rightfield fence, driving in three runs.


