You, and each of you, are hereby notified that Bill Barrett Corporation has filed and there is pending an Application with the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas pursuant to the K.A.R. 82-3-103a requesting an order approving the Notice of Intent for the drilling of a horizontal well known as the Helman 8-24 well in Sherman County, Kansas.

You are further notified that the Helman 8-24 well surface location is 2,232' from the North line and 400' from the East line of Section 24, Township 6 South, Range 40 West, and that the bottom hole location of said well will be 1,188' from the North line and 1,951' from the East line of said Section 24, Township 6 South, Range 40 West. The said well will be drilled to and completed in the Niobrara formation within the Helman Spacing Unit which comprises all of said Section 24.

You are further notified that unless a written protest is received by the State Corporation Commission within fifteen (15) days after publication of this Notice, the Application will be granted administratively following said fifteen (15) day period. GENERAL NOTICE TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Kansas Noxious Weed Law K.S.A. 2-1314 et seq requires all persons who own or supervise land in Kansas to control and eradicate all weeds declared noxious by legislative action. The weeds declared noxious are: field bindweed, musk thistle, sericea lespedeza, johnson grass, bur ragweed, Canada thistle, leafy spurge, hoary cress, quack grass, Russian knapweed, kudzu and pignut. Bull Thistle and/or multiflow rose is/are a County Option Noxious Weed/Weeds declared noxious by the Board of County Commissioners of Sherman County. Notice is hereby given pursuant to the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to every person who owns or supervises land in Sherman County that noxious weeds growing or found on such land shall be controlled and eradicated. Control is defined as preventing the production of viable seed and the vegetative spread of the plant.

Failure to observe this notice may result in the County:

1. Serving a legal notice requiring control of the noxious weeds within a minimum of five days. Failure to control the noxious weeds within the time period allowed may result in the county treating the noxious weeds at the landowners expense and placing a lien on the property if the bill is not paid within 30 days or,
2. Filing criminal charges for non compliance. Conviction for non compliance may result in a fine of \$ 100 per day of non-compliance with a maximum fine of \$1500.

The public is also hereby notified that it is a violation of the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to barter, sell or give away infested nursery stock or livestock feed unless the feed is fed on the farm

where grown or sold to a commercial processor that will destroy the viability of the noxious weed seed. Custom harvesting machines must be labeled with a label provided by the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture and must be free of all weed seed and litter when entering the State and when leaving a field infested with noxious weeds.
