In the 10 and under group, it was Laine Herl at 120. Seth Miller placed first at 72 pounds in the 12 and under competition.

In the 14 and under category, first place went to Kade Sheldon at 85, A.J. Stephens at 130 pounds, Bobby Doxon at 235, and Casey House at 265. At 16 and under, it was Jon Cook at 165 and Mark Starr at 245.
