The Goodland Star-News After years of effort by players, parents and fans, high school baseball has become a reality for Goodland, and the Cowboys will open their season at 4:15 p.m. against the Cougars of Burlington High at Centennial Park.

The Cowboys, who started practice on March 2, have 16 players on their roster, the majority of whom have several seasons of experience with the American Legion, Goodland Outlaws and K-18 teams. Steve Jimenez, director of the

Goodland Activities Center, is the Cowboys coach. Jimenez played high school baseball in Denver, graduating from Ranum High in 1990.

He played two seasons for the Cougars of Barton County Community College, then two with the Tigers of Fort Hays State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science in sociology in 1995.

Helping Jimenez this season is assistant coach David Avila, a supervisor at Northern Sun Industries. Freshman Forrest Trachsel is the team's manager.
