Boys sixth, girls ninth at Ogallala Invitational

The Goodland High School track and field teams opened their seasons on Saturday at the Ogallala Invitational in Nebraska with the Cowboys finishing sixth and the Cowgirls ninth among the 11 teams. Coach Don Smith said it was a good start to the season. He said he was especially pleased with three things: the effort everybody gave, the attitude they displayed during the competition and the cooperative spirit the team members showed throughout the trip.

Smith said every athlete gave his or her best, and although some did not do as well as they would have liked, they all tried hard in every event they entered. He said he was glad to see the support the athletes gave each other, offering encouragement and help all day.

Smith said the athletes gave everything the coaches asked for and did their best to make the opening meet a good start to the season.

The highlight of the day for Goodland was in the boys 100-meter dash, where senior Lane Winter was first in 11.3 seconds and senior Bret Jarmin right behind him, second in 11.4 seconds.

"I would say as the sprint coach, I was thrilled with their performances all day," said assistant coach Richard Schwasinger. "I am really excited about our potential for the rest of the season when we start out this well as a team."

In Goodland's last event of the day Winter and Jarmin teamed up with senior Wade Taylor and freshman Casey Henderson to win the 4x100-meter relay in 45.4 seconds.

Other top-six performances for Goodland in the boys competition were Winter's third-place finish in the long jump at 20 feet 1/4 inch and senior Anthony Benavides placing fourth in the 400-meter dash in 54.7

seconds.

Benavides also ran the 200-meter dash, as did Henderson and freshman Brett Meissinger. Joining him in the 400-meter dash were Meissinger and junior Brandon Tatman. Henderson also ran the 100-meter dash.

Freshman Dustin Pennington ran in both the 800- and 1,600-meter runs.

Representing Goodland in the long jump, along with Winter, were Benavides and Taylor. Taylor and Winter also did the high jump, and Taylor and Benavides the triple jump. Tatman and junior Jared Robinson were the Cowboys' pole vaulters.

Sophomore Nathan Thomas and freshman Jason Krayca threw the shot, and they with Jarmin com-

peted in the discus.

The Cowgirls were led by sophomore Dani Bedore, who placed third in the triple jump at 32 feet 2 inches and fifth in the long jump at 15 feet 7 inches. Bedore also ran the 100-meter dash.

Sophomore Whitney Dautel came from the back of the pack to place fourth in the 800-meter run in 2 minutes 45.2 seconds. She also

ran in the 1,600-meters, where junior Tiffany Thomas finished sixth in 6 minutes 16.4 seconds. Thomas also ran in the 3,200 meters.

Sophomore Stephanie Sheldon finished in a tie for sixth in the pole vault, clearing 7 feet.

Senior Whitney Carmichael qualified for the final race in the 100-meter dash but had to drop out due to a injury suffered in her pre-

liminary race. That also caused the Cowgirls to scratch the 4x100-meter relay.

Other Cowgirls competing in Ogallala were junior Lisha Tedford in the shot put and discus, and freshman Heidi Yonkey in the long jump and 100-meter dash.

Ogallala High School won the boys competition, with Cozad finishing second and Gothenburg

third. For the girls, it was Gothenburg first, Chase County High of Imperial second and Ogallala third. Goodland was the only Kansas school there.

On Saturday, the Cowboys and Cowgirls head to Norton for a meet starting at 2 p.m. (Mountain Time). On Monday, Goodland will be the host for a freshman/sophomore track meet starting at 3:45 p.m..
