Dr. David Haning

Dr. David V. Haning, 68, Shinnston, W. Va., a Goodland high school graduate and a cousin of John (Judy) Bateman of Goodland, died suddenly Sunday, April 3, 2005, at the home of his youngest son in Yorktown, Va.

He was born Dec. 7, 1936, in Atchison, the son of James Polk and Olive Louise (Elliott) Haning. The family moved to Goodland in the mid-1940s. He attended school in Goodland and graduated from Sherman Community High School in 1955. He was active in wrestling and football.

Mr. Haning later worked at Gar's Shoe Repair in Goodland. He at-

tended Kansas Wesleyan University and graduated in 1959. He worked for the U.S. Border Patrol in 1959 and 1960, stationed in Calexico, Calif.

He was drafted into the Army in 1960 and served at Walter Reed Army Research Center as a medical lab specialist until his discharge in 1962.

On Nov. 10, 1961, he married Priscilla Nuzum.

As a civilian, he continued to work as a lab specialist in the department of immunochemistry at Walter Reed until he moved to West Virginia in 1964. He then worked in the department of biochemistry at West Virginia University while awaiting acceptance into dental school. After his graduation from dental school in 1969, he operated a small practice in Shinnston until his retirement in 1999.

Haning was a member of the Mountain Top Baptist Church. He was an avid golfer and a former board member of Green Hills Country Club in Fairmont, W. Va. He was

a past governor for the Shinnston Moose Lodge.

Preceding him in death were his parents and a brother, Gerald Lee Haning.

Survivors include his wife; two sons, Steven (Leslie) Haning of Shinnston and Scott (Lisa) Haning of Yorktown, Va.; a daughter, Susan Haning of Alexandria, Va.; two sisters, Judy (Ken) Amling of Fort Collins, Colo., and June (Bruce) Pooley of Lakewood, Colo.
