

Cowgirls lose twice to Lady Eagles in Colby

The Goodland High Cowgirls dropped both games of a softball doubleheader in Colby on Friday, with the Lady Eagles winning the first game 10-3 and the second 10-0.

The losses evened the Cowgirls' record at 4-4.
In the opener, Colby built up an 8-0 lead while holding Goodland scoreless until the top of the fifth inning, when the Cowgirls scored their first run. Colby responded with two runs in the bottom of the inning to make it 10-1. Goodland scored two more runs in the top of the sixth, and neither team scored

again, making the final 10-3.
In the second game, the Eagles scored in each inning, getting two in the fifth to win the game on the "10 after five" rule. Colby pitcher Logan Wark faced just 17 Goodland batters in five innings to shut out the Cowgirls.
"It looked like we played tired against Colby," said Coach Andy Scheopner. "Although our fielding was effective, our hitting and pitching were a bit off."
In the first game, Colby pitcher Sarah Redmond opened the game by striking out Goodland's first three batters. In the bottom of the inning, junior pitcher Jordan

Frazier had a rough start, walking four of the Eagles first six batters. Trailing 1-0 with two outs and the bases loaded, Goodland called a timeout, and Frazier struck out the next batter on four pitches to end the inning.
In the top of the second, Redmond struck out the first two batters, then Frazier tagged her for a double to left field. However, the next Cowgirl batter was thrown out at first. In the bottom of the inning, the Eagles picked up three more runs to increase their lead to 4-0.
Goodland suffered its second "three-and-out" of the game in the top of the third. In the bottom of the

inning, after the first Colby batter got on base, freshman second baseman Andrea Wolak "snagged" a line drive out of the air and was able double off the runner at first. Then Frazier got her third strikeout of the game to end the inning.
In the fourth, Colby continued to keep Goodland off the scoreboard, facing just four batters. However, in their turn at bat, the Eagles sent eight batters to the plate and added four runs to their lead.
Frazier started the fifth inning with a single that got by Colby's first baseman. Later, with two outs, Wolak hit a fly ball to right which was dropped, allowing Frazier to

score. Colby responded with a pair of runs in the bottom of the fifth to make it 10-1.
After the Eagle defense got the first two Goodland batters out in the top of the sixth, junior Melissa Swager hit a single to left. Junior Justeen Koehler hit a single down the right-field line, sending Swager to third. Frazier stepped up to the plate next, hitting a double up the middle to score both runners.
The Cowgirls then held Colby to a "three-and-out," but Colby returned the favor in the top of the seventh to end the game 10-3.
The Colby defense got tougher in the second game, getting 15 of the

first 17 Goodland batters out while allowing just two walks. On offense, the Eagles scored at least one run during each turn at bat. Leading 8-0 in the bottom of the fifth with the bases loaded and two outs, Colby's Shawna Cox hit a single up the middle, scoring two runs to make it 10-0 and ending the game.
Colby won both junior varsity games, 13-3 and 14-11. The Goodland junior varsity is 2-4 for the season.
The Cowgirls are on an 11-day break from competition before playing host to the Lady Indians of Hays for a doubleheader next Tuesday at 3 p.m. at Centennial Park.

Cowboys finish fifth

The Goodland Cowboys track and field team finished fifth at the Norton Invitational on Saturday, winning two events.
Goodland sophomore Kerek Mason won the 1,600-meter run in 5 minutes 3.26 seconds.
The Cowboys 4x100-meter relay team of seniors Lane Winter, Bret Jarmin and Wade Taylor and freshman Casey Henderson won for the second straight week, finishing in 45.81 seconds.
Winter was second in the 100-meter dash in 11.21 seconds with Jarmin finishing fourth and Henderson fifth.
Henderson also ran in the 200-meter dash, as did Mason and freshman Brett Meissinger.
Senior Anthony Benavides placed sixth in the 400-meter dash in 56.78 seconds.
Also competing for Goodland at that distance were junior Brandon Tatman and sophomore Troy Harrison.
Freshmen Dustin Pennington and Toby Hurst both competed in the 800 and 1,600-meter runs.
Taylor, Tatman, Mason and Harrison teamed up to finish fourth in the 4x400-meter relay in 3 minutes 51.21 seconds.
Winter placed fourth in both the high jump and long jump, clearing 5 feet 10 inches and leaping 18 feet 6.5 inches respectively.

Taylor was fourth in the triple jump going 37 feet 7.5 inches.
Benavides and freshman Matthew Hamilton also competed in the long jump for the Cowboys.
Harrison and junior Cory Yarbrough were in the high jump, and Harrison also did the triple jump.
Junior Jared Robinson cleared 9 feet, 6 inches to finish in a tie for fifth in the pole vault.
Tatman and freshman Jordan Albers also vaulted.
Jarmin was second in the javelin with a throw of 167 feet, 9 inches; joining him in the event were Taylor and Meissinger.
Jarmin also threw the discus. Freshmen Bobby Doxon and Jason Krayca threw the shot and discus.
Henderson joined the pair in the shot put.
Coach Don Smith said, in Norton, several Cowboys tried

events for the first time in competition and the meet was the first interscholastic experience for many of the freshman and even some of the sophomores.
"We are still learning about ourselves," Smith said, "however, I was very pleased with the efforts we got from the team."
The Panthers of Phillipsburg finished first with 128 points.
The host team, Norton, was second with 120.5 and Smith Center third with 98.
Goodland scored 60.5 points, a half point behind Colby and a half point ahead of Northern Valley High of Almena.
Logan was seventh.
Several members of Goodland teams will be in Wichita on Friday for the K.T. Woodman Classic in Cessna Stadium at Wichita State University. The action starts at 7:15 a.m. (Mountain Time).

Girls team runs second of seven in Norton

The Goodland Cowgirls had a good day on Saturday at the Norton Invitational track meet, finishing second out of seven teams and winning three events.
Senior Kara Angelos, sophomore Dani Bedore and sophomore Emily Murray each won one event and placed second in another.
Angelos and Murray placed one-two in two events, the 100-meter intermediate hurdles and the 300-meter low hurdles.
Angelos won the 100-meter hurdles in 17 seconds and was second at 300 in 51.4.
Murray won the 300 meters in 51.32 seconds and was second in the 100 in 17.46.
Bedore won the triple jump, leaping 31 feet 7 inches, and was second in the long jump at 14 feet 10 inches.
Angelos, Murray, Bedore and sophomore Kaylee Billinger teamed to place second in the 4x100-meter relay in 53.5 seconds.
Murray, Bedore, Billinger and junior Kali Rietcheck finished fourth in the 4x400-meter relay in 4 minutes 38.19 seconds.

Billinger placed second in the 100-meter dash in 13.28 seconds and was third in the 200 meters in 27.75 seconds.
Rietcheck placed third in the 400-meter dash in 1 minute 10.8 seconds.
Sophomore Emily Linden was fourth at 400 meters and freshman Amanda Amthor was sixth.
Linden also ran the 200-meter dash. Junior Tiffany Thomas placed fourth in the 1,600-meter run and was fifth at 3,200 meters.
Her times were 6 minutes 9.06 seconds and 14 minutes 13.81 seconds.
Sophomore Whitney Dautel finished fifth in the 1,600-meters in 6 minutes 17.56 seconds.
Dautel and freshman Halli Stone both ran the 800 meters. Stone also competed in the javelin.
Sophomore Stephanie Sheldon was second in the pole vault, clearing 7 feet 6 inches, with Amthor, who cleared 7 feet, fifth.
Sheldon also ran the 100-meter dash.
Junior Lisha Tedford placed third

in the discus with a toss of 104 feet and was fourth in the shot put with 31 feet, 2 inches. Sophomore Kelli Bellamy threw both the discus and shot.
Freshman Heidi Yonkey has a busy day, running in the 100-meter dash, and competing in the long and triple jumps.
Coach Don Smith said he was pleased by the efforts the athletes gave during the meet especially since several were trying events for the first time in competition.
The Lady Eagles of Colby won

the team competition, scoring 133.5 points, followed by Goodland with 119. Smith Center was third, Phillipsburg fourth, Northern Valley fifth, Logan sixth and the host team Norton seventh.
Smith said Goodland will send about 14 athletes, boys and girls, to the K.T. Woodman Classic on Friday being held in Cessna Stadium at Wichita State University.
The action starts at 7:15 (Mountain Time) with the girls 3,200-meter run and the boys 4x100-meter relay.

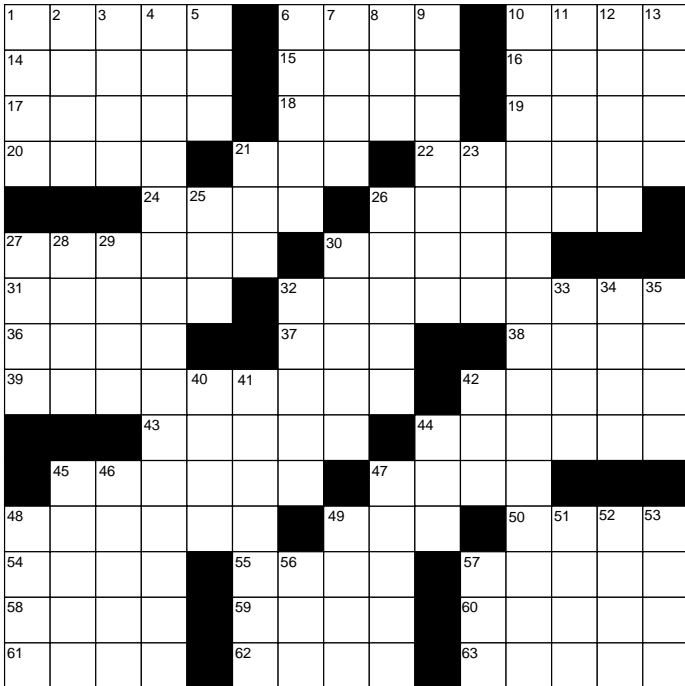
