The Goodland Cowboys track and field team finished fifth at the Norton Invitational on Saturday, winning two events.

Goodland sophomore Kerek Mason won the 1,600-meter run in 5 minutes 3.26 seconds.

The Cowboys 4x100-meter relay team of seniors Lane Winter, Bret Jarmin and Wade Taylor and freshman Casey Henderson won for the second straight week, finishing in 45.81 seconds.

Winter was second in the 100meter dash in 11.21 seconds with Jarmin finishing fourth and Henderson fifth.

Henderson also ran in the 200meter dash, as did Mason and freshman Brett Meissinger.

Senior Anthony Benavides placed sixth in the 400-meter dash in 56.78 seconds.

Also competing for Goodland at that distance were junior Brandon Tatman and sophomore Troy Harrison.

Freshmen Dustin Pennington and Toby Hurst both competed in the 800 and 1,600-meter runs.

Taylor, Tatman, Mason and Harrison teamed up to finish fourth in the 4x400-meter relay in 3 minutes 51.21 seconds.
