### More than 20 tons lugged out By Tom Betz

The Goodland Star-News A smaller crew gathered Saturday morning to tackle the second round of the citywide clean up being guided by the Chamber of Commerce Beautification Committee.

Despite their smaller numbers, the volunteers collected as much or more than the 20 tons of trash and limbs hauled away in the first round on Saturday, April 2.

Ken Clouse, head of the beautification committee and president of Northwest Kansas Technical College, said 40 volunteers helped Saturday.

The city had three trucks and drivers, plus a county truck and loader which were kept busy with tree branches.

Rich Simon, superintendent of public works, said the city trucks each made eight trips and the county made 10 trips to the transfer station with limbs. He said there were two large loads of concrete and brick, and two of furniture and one of mattresses
