## Cowboys lose two to Eagles

## Track team places 18th in Wichita

The Cowboys scored seven points at the K.T. Woodman Track Classic on Friday in Wichita, finishing 18th among the 26 Class 3A and 4A schools competing.

Senior Bret Jarmin earned six points by placing third in the javelin with a throw of 173 feet 4 inches.

Senior Drew Wilkens got the other point for Goodland, finishing sixth in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 42.83 seconds.

Jarmin also competed in the 100-meter dash and Wilkens in the 110-meter high hurdles.

Other Cowboys at the meet were seniors Wade Taylor and Lane Winter, sophomore Kerek Mason and freshman Casey Henderson. Taylor did the long and triple jumps. Winter ran the 100-meter dash and did the long jump. Mason competed in the 200-meter dash and the 1,600-meter run. Henderson ran the 100 and 200-meter dashes, and tired his hand at the shot put.

Jarmin, Taylor, Winter and Henderson teamed up in the 4x100-meter relay. Later, Jarmin and Taylor got with Mason and Wilkens for the 4x400 meter relay.

Although they did not score

any points, five Cowgirls got to compete among the best in the state. Senior Kara Angelos and sophomore Emily Murray both ran the 100-meter high and 300-meter low hurdles. Junior Kali Rietschek ran the 400-meter dash and sophomore Kaylee Billinger ran in the 100 and 200-meter dashes. Junior Lisha Tedford threw the shot and discus.

Angelos, Rietschek, Billinger and Murray teamed up for both the 4x100- and 4x400-meter relays.

Wichita-Independent won the boys Class 3-4A team competition with Concordia High taking the girls title. The meet was held at Cessna Stadium on the campus of Wichita State University.

Two former Cowboys also were there participating in college competition.

Aaron Gittinger, a sophomore at Butler County Community College, ran the 400-meter dash. Josef Felver, a freshman at Southwestern College, ran in both the 100 and 200 meters.

Both of Goodland's track and field teams will be competing at the Scott City Relays starting at 8:30 a.m. (Mountain Time) today.

The Goodland High baseball team had a tough time in Colby on Friday, as the Eagles swept a doubleheader from the Cowboys 6-2 and 13-3.

With the wins, Colby improved to 7-1 for the season while Goodland fell to 3-4.

In the first game at Young Memorial Field, the Eagles took a 1-0 lead after the first inning, increasing it to 2-0 in the third. Colby's big inning was the fourth, where, after holding Goodland to a "three-and-out," senior Matt Augustine led off with a solo home run over the right center field fence. Later, the Eagles managed to load the bases, picking up another three runs for a 6-0 lead.

The Cowboys got on the scoreboard in the top of the fifth, when freshman Tanner Smith hit a single through the gap between the first and second basemen, driving in sophomore Tyler Hillmer. Hillmer had opened the inning with a single down the third base line, and a few pitches later he stole second, putting him in scoring position.

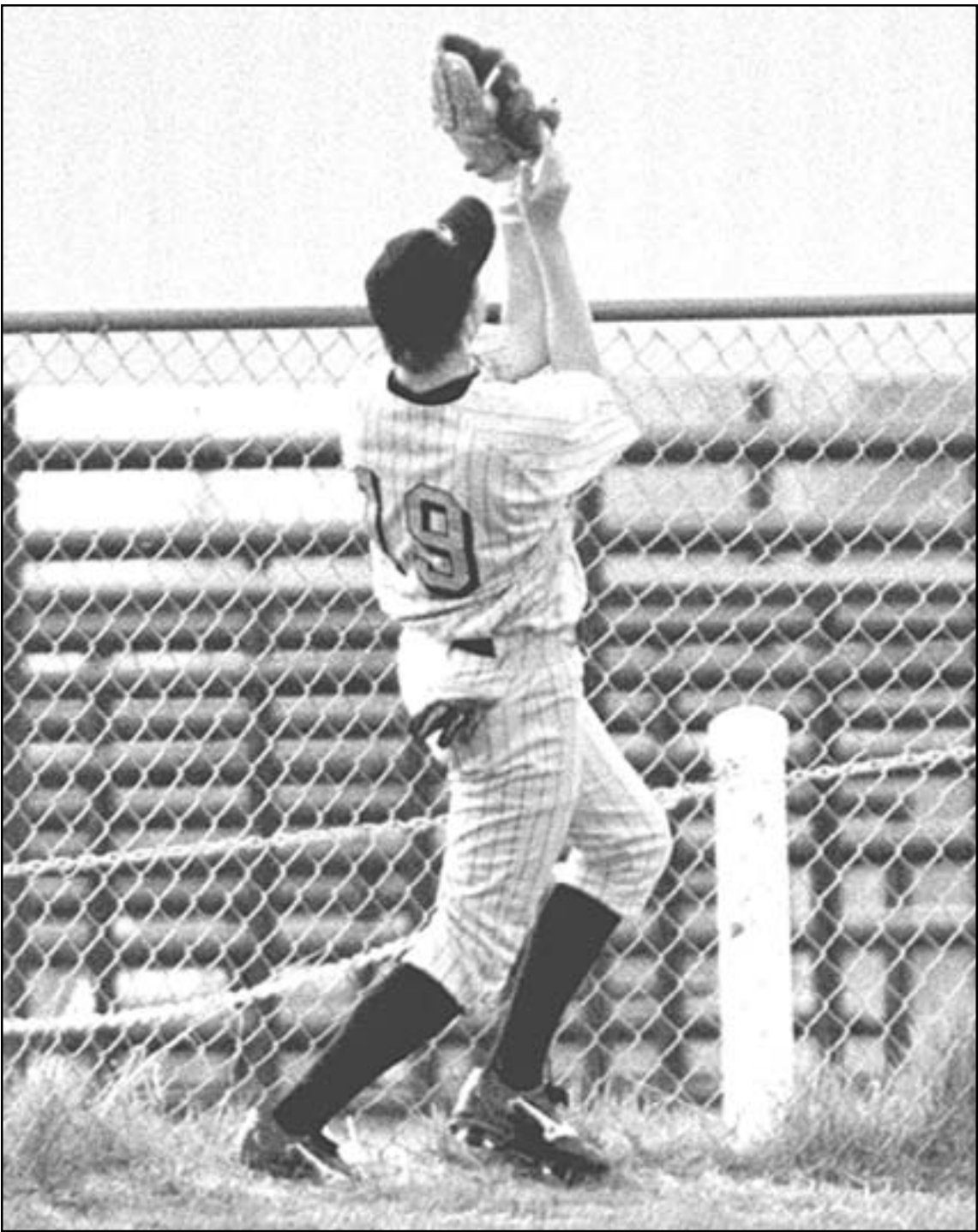
The score stayed 6-1 until the top of the seventh inning when, with two outs, junior Brett Lalicker hit a single to right field which drove in sophomore Andrew Pettibone. Next, junior Wyatt Dautel hit a single up the middle, sending Pettibone to second.

Colby made some defensive changes which included bringing in a new pitcher. The Eagles got the third out with the next Goodland batter to end the game with the final score 6-2.

In the second game, Colby took a 3-0 lead after the first inning. Goodland made it 3-1 after two when Smith stole home just before the Cowboys' third out.

Like the first game, the Eagles came up with a big inning, this time in the third. Colby pitcher Jeremy Dietz struck out the side, then the Eagles sent 10 batters to the plate, loading the bases twice, and scoring five runs to make it 8-1.

The Cowboys picked up a pair of runs in the top of the fourth, but Colby responded with four in the bottom of the inning. With the score 12-3 with two outs in the bottom of the fifth,
