

Goodland scores at tourney

Goodland's Michelle Smith set a school record for the eighth-grade girls discus last Saturday at the Mustang Invitational Track Meet with a throw of 100 feet, 10 inches.

Smith was a double winner for the Lady Mustangs, also taking the shot put with a toss of 33 feet, 4 inches.

Other top-six performances by the eighth-grade girls includes Danielle Pettibone, who placed third in both the 100 and 200-meter dashes, and Hannah Blake, who was third in the 3,200-meter run. Jessica Bauman placed fifth and Heather West sixth in the 100-meter hurdles. Erika Gonzales placed sixth in the discus and Brooke Lennington sixth in the high jump.

The 4x200-meter relay team finished second and both the 4x100 and 4x400-meter relay teams were sixth.

Grant Junior High finished fifth out of the nine eighth-grade girls team competing. Kennedy Middle School of Hays won the team title with 95.5 points, followed by Burlington with 79, Colby with 72 and Scott City with 61. The Lady Mustangs scored 53.

Grant's eighth-grade boys also finished fifth out of nine teams. The Mustangs were led by Zach Lohr, who won the high jump clearing 5 feet 8 inches, and Andrew Taylor, who won the 100-meter hurdles in 17.32 seconds.

Casey House placed second in the shot put. Joining Lohr in the high jump were Josh Lamb, who placed fourth, and Fernando Martinez, who finished in a four-way tie for sixth.

Goodland's boys won the 4x200-meter relay in 1 minute, 50.66 seconds and were third in the 4x100 race and fifth in the 4x400. Colby finished first with 146.25

points. Kennedy was second with 62.25, Idalia third with 61 and Scott City fourth with 56.25. Grant's score was 50.25.

The seventh-grade girls had the best effort for Grant at the meet, finishing fourth. The Lady Mustangs won the 4x200-meter relay in 2 minutes, 7.95 seconds, placing second in the 4x100 and fourth in the 4x400.

Rosa Sandoval placed second in the high jump and fourth in the 100-meter hurdles. Alyssa Brady placed third in both the high jump and pole vault, and was fourth in the 100-meter dash. Ashsley Garza finished sixth in the 100-meter dash.

The girls from Kennedy won the team competition with 110 points, followed by Scott City with 72.5. Colby scored 67 points and Grant 61.

Colton Nelson and Tim Roeder led the seventh-grade boys to a sixth-place finish. Nelson placed second in the discus and third in the shot put, with Roeder placing second in the 1,600-meter run.

Edward Martinez placed fourth in the 100-meter dash and was sixth in the 400-meters. Kevin Amthor placed fifth in the pole vault and sixth in the 800-meter run. Jay Cotter was fifth in the discus.

The seventh-grade Mustangs placed fourth in both the 4x100 and 4x200-meter relays, and were sixth in the 4x400.

Scott City won the team title with 97 points. Burlington was second with 82.5, Wallace County third with 80, Colby fourth with 64 and Kennedy fifth with 44. Goodland scored 41.

The next action for all four teams will be next Thursday for a quadrangular meet in Colby starting at 2 p.m. (Mountain Time).

Cowboys take seventh in Hays

The Cowboys varsity golf team finished seventh at the Bob Blazer/Hays High Invitational on Monday at Smoky Hill Country Club in Hays.

Goodland was led by junior Nathan Linin, who finished with a 10-over-par 81. He ended up in a six-way tie for ninth place but placed out of the top 10 the "off-the-cards" tie-breaker.

Senior Derrick Raymer scored an 86, freshman Jance McKee a 92 and sophomore Jacob Er-ickson a 94.

Senior David Livengood and sophomore Mikey Doll both shot a 106.

Coach Jon McLean said Smoky Hill is a tough course and this was the first time some of the Cowboys had played there. He said although some of the players' scores were OK, he expects the experience will result in better scores when they play there later in the season.

The Salt Hawks of Hutchinson High won the tournament with a score of 311. Hays' "A" team placed second with 321 and Dodge City was third with 326.

Salina South finished fourth with 337, Thomas More Prep-Marian fifth with 340 and Great Bend was sixth with 352. Goodland's score was 353.

Garden City was eighth with 356.

Hutchinson was led by Theo Hart and Scott Kitch, who both finished with a round of 76.

They played each other in an extra-hole tie breaker with Hart coming out on top to take the gold medal.

The Hawks' Justin Raigoza placed fifth with a 78, giving Hutchinson three of the tournament's top five players.

Last Saturday, the Cowboys junior varsity played in the Oberlin Invitational at the Oberlin County Club, finishing 10th. Leading the way was sophomore Brandon Douglas with a 17-over-par 99.

Sophomore Ryan Gausman shot a 107, with freshman Darrick Ihrig just one stroke back. Freshmen Andrew Miller and Aaron Deeds both scored 114, and sophomore Matt Miller shot a 116.

The Eagles of Colby won the tournament, setting a team score record of 317.

Chris Staley led the Eagles with a tournament record 72, winning the gold medal. Teammate Chris Finley placed second, shooting a 76. Colby had four of the top 10 players.

The varsity and junior varsity will hit the links again on Tuesday for a tournament in Hoxie. Other teams expected to play there are Rawlins County of Atwood, Sharon Springs, Quinter, Oakley, Stockton and Trego Community of WaKeeney.

Goodland will be the host for the Northwest Kansas League Tournament on Sunday, May 1, at Sugar Hills Golf Club. Tee-off is scheduled for 2 p.m.

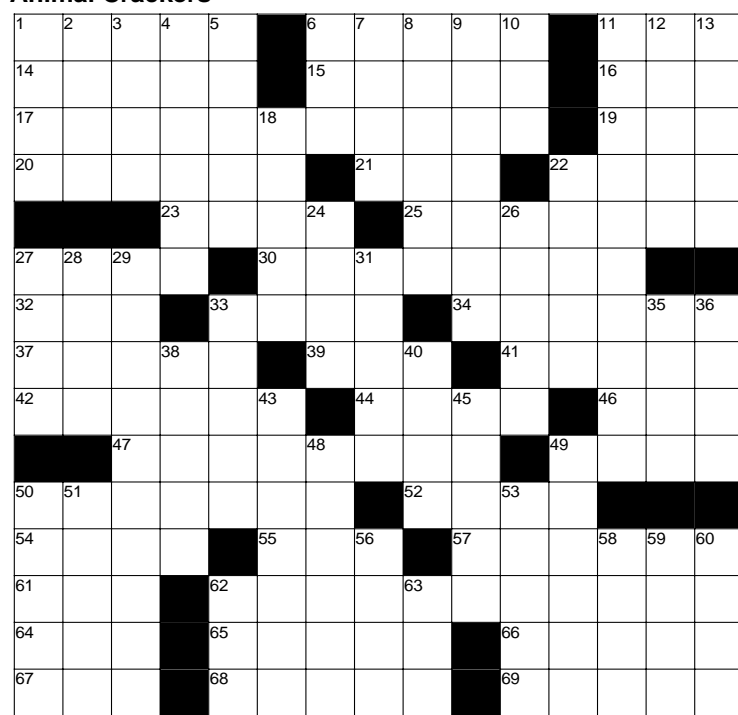
