

Cowboys take sixth at Holcomb track meet

The Goodland Cowboys finished sixth out of 11 teams at the Holcomb Invitational track meet on April 22.

Senior Lane Winter cleared 5 feet 10 inches to win the high jump. Winter qualified for the final heat of the 100-meter dash by running it in 11.43 seconds in the preliminaries, but was disqualified from the final for a false start.

Senior Bret Jarmin placed second in the javelin with a throw of 165 feet 5 inches and finished third in the 100-meter dash. Senior Drew Wilkens placed third in the 100-meter high hurdles and was fifth in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles.

Sophomore Kerek Mason finished third in the 1,600-meter run and fifth at 800 meters. Freshman Toby Hurst ran with Mason in both races and also competed in the pole vault.

Senior Wade Taylor finished fifth in both the 400-meter dash and the triple jump. Senior Anthony Benavides also ran the 400.

Other Cowboys competing in Holcomb were juniors Cory Yarbrough, in the high and long jumps; Jared Robinson, in the pole vault; and Brandon Tatman in the long jump. Sophomore Troy Harrison ran the 200-meter dash, threw the javelin and did the triple jump. Freshman Robert Doxon competed in the shot put and discus.

The 4x100-meter relay team of Taylor, Wilkens, Winter and Jarmin placed second, running the race in 45.53 seconds. Taylor, Wilkens and Jarmin later teamed up with Ben-

avides to place fifth in the 4x400-meter relay.

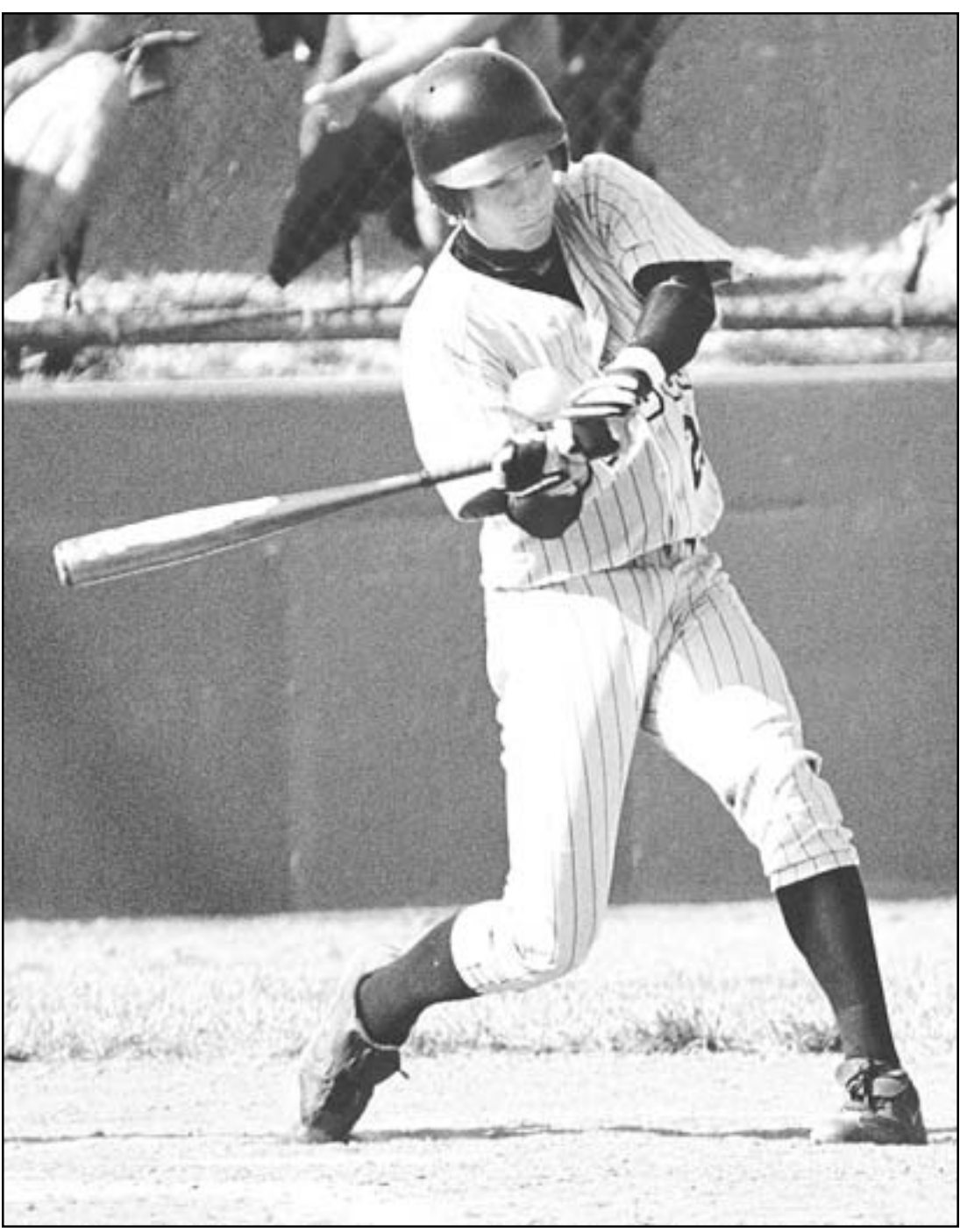
The Tigers of Ulysses won the boys team title with 151 points. Lakin was second with 75, Colby third with 61 and Hugoton fourth just one point behind the Eagles. Scott City was fifth with 59 points, three points better than Goodland.

Coach Don Smith said he was more pleased with the team's results this time than he was after the Scott City meet three days earlier. He said with minor improvements in couple of the events in Holcomb the Cowboys could have challenged for a trophy.

The Tri-State Relays scheduled for this past Friday in Goodland were canceled due to weather for the second straight year.

Both the Cowboys and Cowgirls will be in Oberlin today and will travel to Colby for another meet on Friday. Both start at 2 p.m. (Mountain Time).

The Northwest Kansas League meet will be in Hoxie on Friday, May 13.

Ex-Cowboy has key play

Former Cowboy Jordan Bedore intercepted a pass and made six tackles during Kansas State University's spring football game Saturday in Manhattan.

Bedore, playing defensive tackle for the white squad, intercepted a pass late in the first quarter on the purple squad's 36-yard line, returning it 29 yards. The interception led to a 22-yard field goal, giving white a 3-0 lead.

Four of Bedore's six tackles were solo, including a quarterback sack in the first quarter for a four-yard loss. He shared a second sack in the second quarter with defensive end Vlad Faustin who, like Bedore, is a redshirt freshman.

Jordan, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, is the son of Dustin and Barb Bedore of Goodland. As a fullback, Jordan led the Cowboys in rushing his senior season, gaining 1,685 yards and scoring 18 touchdowns. He also led the team in tackles with 145 as Goodland's middle linebacker. Jordan was a Northwest Kansas All-League first-team pick in both positions for the 2003 season.

In Saturday's game, the purple squad tied the score at 3 on the last play of the first quarter with a 56-yard field goal. White responded with a 56-yarder of its own early in the second quarter and later scored a touchdown, taking a 12-3 halftime lead.

Neither team scored in the third pe-

riod. In the final six minutes of the fourth quarter, the white quarterback, junior Allen Webb, passed for a pair of touchdowns to make the final score 26-3.

Webb, who started in five of the 10 games he played in for the Wildcats last season, completed 13 of 24 passes for 105 yards. He was the game's leading rusher, gaining 113 yards on 19 carries. He scored the game's only rushing touchdown on a one-yard plunge in the second quarter.

Another player from northwest Kansas who saw action on Saturday was sophomore running back Terry Petrie, a 2003 graduate of Norton High. Petrie gained 10 yards on three carries for the purple squad, including a six-yard run for a first down in the second quarter.

The Wildcats will open the 2005 season on Sept. 3 at home against the Golden Panthers of Florida International University.

Former Cowgirl takes second

Former Cowgirl Jessica Osborn placed second at the junior college regional golf tournament April 24-25 at the Park Hills Country Club in Pratt.

Osborn, a freshman at Dodge City Community College, finished two strokes behind the champion, teammate Emma Taylor, who shot a 165 for 36 holes. Both women shot a 15-over-par 86 on the first day, with Taylor shooting a 79 on the second while Osborn finished with an 81.

The Lady Conquistadors won the National Junior College Athletic

Association Region VI tournament with a team score of 702, 21 strokes better the runner-up and defending champion Pratt Community College.

Helping Dodge City win the championship were sophomore Chasity Maune and freshman Lauren Williams, who tied for seventh place at 185.

Krystle McCorgary of Pratt placed third with a 170 and had the best first-day score with an 85. Taylor's 79 was the best round on the second day.

Taylor, Osborn, McCorgary,

Hannah Bush of Pratt and Dawn Eshbaugh of Barton County Community College were named to the 2005 women's All-Region VI Team. Bush placed fourth with 177 and Eshbaugh fifth at 180.

The Conquistadors advance to the national tournament May 16-19 at the Ladies Professional Golf Association International course in Daytona Beach, Fla. Individual national qualifiers include McCorgary, Bush, Eshbaugh, Lindsay Hoover of Pratt and Rachel Locke of Barton County.

Osborn, a four-year letter winner in golf in high school, placed in the top four in all four tournaments her team played in this spring.

Goodland graduate hits first home run

Nate Thompson, a senior at Dallas Baptist University, hit his first home run of the season on April 23, driving in three runs as the Patriots defeated Texas Wesleyan University 15-0.

Thompson entered the game as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning, then hit the three-run blast. He has seen action in six games this season, batting .222, scoring three runs and driving in five.

Dallas Baptist is now 27-20 for the season after sweeping a three-game home series against the University of Texas-Pan American this weekend. The Patriots won 13-3 on Thursday, 15-2 on Friday and 8-2 on Saturday.

Nate, a 2001 graduate of Goodland High, is the son of Mac and Pat Thompson of Goodland.

He played four seasons on the Cowboys basketball team, the final

two on the varsity. Nate also was a member of the X-Pressos and the National Honor Society.

Nate's brother Mitch, a 1983 graduate of Goodland High, is in his 11th season as an assistant baseball coach at Baylor University.

He played college ball for the Tigers of Fort Hays State University, where he graduated in 1988.

Dallas Baptist is a NCAA Division II school and a member of the Heartland Conference.

However the Patriots are in their second season as a Division I independent in baseball.

Dallas Baptist won the National Christian College Athletic Association baseball championship in 2004 after finishing as the national runner-up in 2003.

The Patriots have a road game against Texas State University-San Marcos today and will play a three-

game series against Texas Tech in Lubbock on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

They will end the regular season on May 14 with a doubleheader against the University of Texas at Austin.

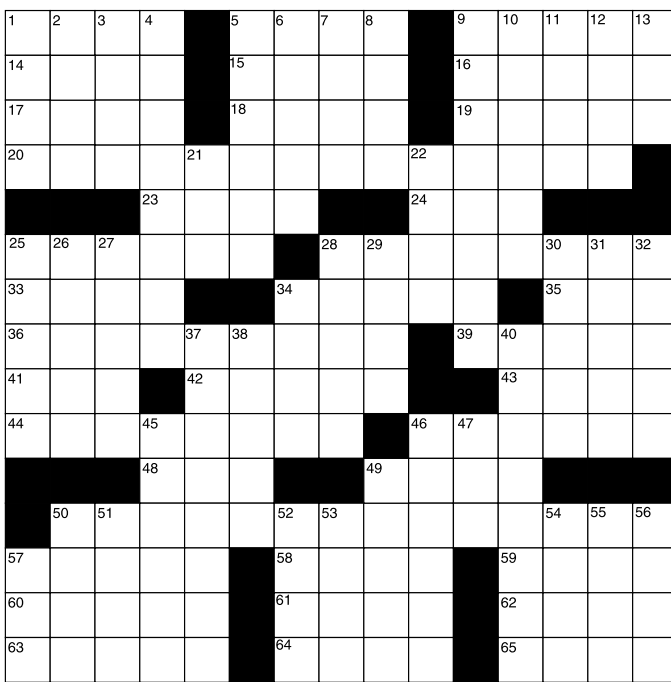
