

Boys third in Colby

Senior Lane Winter led the Cowboys to a third-place finish at Friday's track meet in Colby.

Winter won the 200-meter dash with a time of 22.68 seconds. He also cleared 5 feet 10 inches to place second in the high jump and ran the 100-meter dash in 11.18 seconds to finish in a tie for second.

Winter teamed up with seniors Bret Jarmin and Wade Taylor along with freshman Casey Henderson to place second in the 4x100-meter relay running it in 44.92 seconds.

Jarmin was second in the javelin with a throw of 165 feet 7 inches. He also placed sixth in both the 100-meter dash and the discus. Taylor placed fifth in the 400-meter dash and the triple jump, and also competed in the javelin. Henderson took fifth in the 100-meter dash and shot put, and also ran the 200-meter dash.

Sophomore Kerek Mason placed second in the 1,600-meter run finishing in 4 minutes 47.83 seconds, a personal best.

Freshman Robert Doxon was sixth in the shot put and also competed in the discus. Sophomore Nathan Thomas and freshman Jason Krayca both competed in the shot put and discus. Thomas also threw the javelin.

Junior Cory Yarbrough competed in the high and long jumps, and did the shot put. Junior Brandon Tatman did the long jump and pole vault. Junior Jared Robinson also tried his hand at the pole vault.

Sophomore Troy Harrison ran in the 400-meter dash, and did the high and triple jumps. Freshman Brett Meissinger ran the 200 and 400-meter dashes, and threw the javelin.

Freshman Toby Hurst ran the 3,200-meter run and did the pole vault. Freshman Dustin Pennington competed in the 800-meter run and did the long jump. Freshman Matthew Hamilton did the long jump and javelin.

Robinson, Harrison, Hurst and Pennington teamed up to run the 4x800-meter relay for the Cowboys.

The Ulysses Tigers won the team competition scoring 151 points. Holcomb finished second with 81 while Goodland scored 59. Colby was fourth with 48.

Winter, Jarmin and Goodland's 4x100-meter relay team were listed in the *Salina Journal's* area track and field honor roll which appeared Friday's edition. Winter made the list in the 100-meter dash and high jump, with Jarmin making it in the javelin.

Girls place fourth

The Cowgirls placed fourth at the track meet in Colby on Friday led by sophomore Kaylee Billinger's first-place finish in the 100-meter dash. Her time was 13.23 seconds.

Senior Kara Angelos placed second in the 100-meter high hurdles finishing in 16.04 seconds. Sophomore Emily Murray was second in the 300-meter low hurdles running it in 49.99 seconds. Billinger, Angelos, Murray and sophomore Dani Bedore teamed up to place second in the 4x100-meter relay finishing in 52.79 seconds.

Third-place finishers for Goodland include junior Lisha Tedford, in the discus; sophomore Stephanie Sheldon, in the pole vault; and Bedore in the triple jump. Bedore also finished fourth in the long jump and Tedford was fifth in the shot put.

Junior Tiffany Thomas placed sixth in the 800-meter dash and competed in the 1,600-meter run along with sophomore Whitney Dautel. Dautel also did the 3,200-meter run.

Other Cowgirls competing in Colby were senior Whitney Carmichael, in the 100-meter dash; junior Kali Rietcheck, in the 400-meter dash; sophomore Emily Linden in the 200-meter dash; and sophomore Nicole David, in the javelin.

Sophomore Kerri Bellamy competed in the discus and shot put. Freshman Heidi Yonkey ran the 200 and 400-meter dashes and did the long jump. Freshman Halli Stone competed in the 800-meter run and threw the javelin, and freshman Amanda Amthor tried her hand at

the pole vault. Angelos, Rietcheck, Linden and Murray made up the Cowgirls' 4x400-meter relay team.

The Lady Eagles of Colby won the meet with 107 points followed by Holcomb with 101. St. Francis was third with 62. Goodland scored 59.

Angelos made the *Salina Journal's* area track and field honor roll for the 100-meter hurdles. The roll appeared at the bottom of page 3 in Friday's edition.

Cowboys lose to Ulysses, Colby

The Goodland High School baseball team came close to breaking its eight-game losing streak losing 4-3 to Ulysses in the first of two games the Cowboys played on Thursday in Colby.

In the second game Goodland lost to Colby 11-1 after six innings. In Thursday's first game at Young Memorial Park Colby defeated Ulysses 10-4.

Against Ulysses, the Cowboys took a 1-0 lead in the top of the second inning but the Tigers responded with two runs in the bottom of the inning then added another in the bottom of the third for a 3-1 lead. Goodland came back with two in the top of the fourth to tie the game at 3.

The score remained tied until the bottom of the sixth when, with the bases loaded, Ulysses scored a run to retake the lead 4-3. The Tigers then held Goodland to a "three-and-out" in the top of the seventh ending the game.

"We competed hard all game but couldn't come up with the key hits," Cowboy coach Steve Jimenez said.

Against Colby, the score stayed a scoreless tie until the bottom of the second inning when the Eagles sent 10 batters to the plate scoring six runs. Colby added another run in the fourth inning and one more in the fifth.

Goodland got its only run of the game in the top of the sixth, but the Eagles responded with three in the bottom of the inning to make it 11-1 ending the game by rule.

The losses extended the Cowboys' losing streak to 10 games which started after the team won its first three games.

Goodland suffered a "three-and-out" to start its game with Ulysses. The bottom of the inning was highlighted by some "heads up" defense by the Cowboys catching a Tiger runner off base for the second out then catching the next runner trying to steal second base for the third.

Goodland took a 1-0 in the top of the second when junior Wyatt Dautel was walked with the bases loaded sending senior Brock Lohr home. In the bottom of the inning Ulysses tied the score when Trent Baker hit a triple to left field driving in a run. The Tigers took the lead a short time later when Baker scored to make it 2-1.

Ulysses then made it 3-1 by adding a run in the bottom of the third inning. In the top of the fourth, the Cowboys scored when Dautel hit a single to right center field scoring sophomore Tyler Hillmer.

On the next pitch Dautel stole second and then with the next pitch got to third on a throwing error while trying to pick him off. Senior Jake Alander then hit a single to center field driving in Dautel tying the score at 3-1.

Junior Brandon Zelfer relieved Dautel on the mound in the bottom of the fourth. The score remained tied at 3 until the bottom of the sixth inning when, with two out, the Tigers were able to load the bases. Ulysses scored the go-ahead run on a base hit which left the bases loaded but the next Tiger batter flew

out to center field ending the inning.

Ulysses then held the Cowboys to their fourth "three-and-out" of the game preserving the Tigers' 4-3 victory.

"Wyatt and Brandon did a good job pitching for us," said Jimenez, "but we continue to struggle at the plate."

Against Colby, the Cowboys had a chance at an early lead in the top of the first when Zelfer tried to score from second base on a hit by Lohr. However, he was tagged out at home plate for Goodland's third out. The Cowboys then held Colby to a "three-and-out" in the bottom of the first and the Eagles returned the favor in the top of the second.

In the bottom of the second three Colby hits helped out by four Cowboy errors led to six runs for the Eagles. The score stayed 6-0 until the bottom of the fourth when Colby picked up a run on a passed ball with the bases loaded to make it 7-0. Lohr struck out two of the Eagles' last three batters of the inning, each with the bases loaded, limiting Colby to just one run.

Junior Derek Fenner relieved Lohr in the fifth inning facing six

batters and giving up a run making Colby's lead 8-0 going into the sixth. In the top of the inning, Goodland was able to load the bases with just one out when Lohr scored on a fielder's choice which also left runners at second and third with two outs. However the next Goodland batter struck out leaving the score 8-1.

In the bottom of the sixth, Colby again managed to load the bases after which the Cowboys walked two Eagle batters making it 10-1. Colby got the winning run when, with the bases still loaded, an Eagle batter was hit by a pitch ending the game by rule.

"Colby did a good job of keeping our hitters off balance," Jimenez said. "We've had a lot of games lately and I thought out finally wore down a little."

The last games of the regular season will be played on Friday starting at 3 p.m. at Memorial Field against the Hays Indians.

"We've lost five games by a total of nine runs," said Jimenez. "We need to figure out how to make plays when it counts."

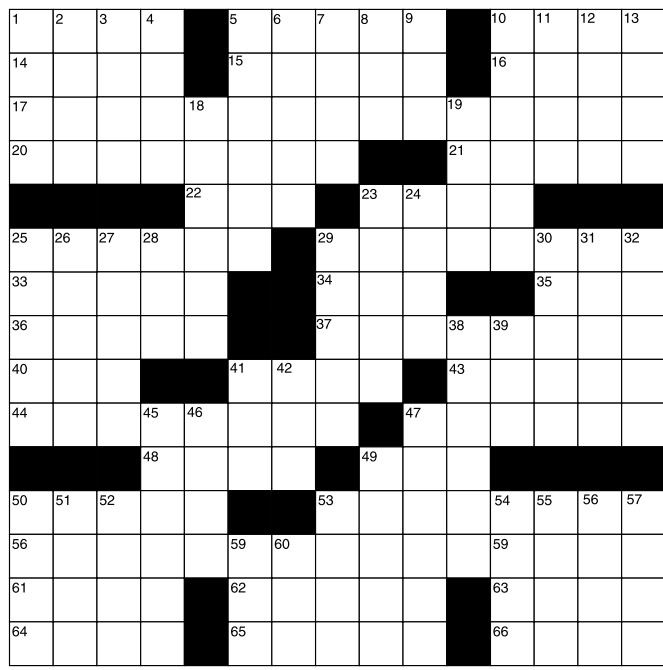

Golf team takes third at Colby tournament

Sophomore Nathan Linin placed second at the Colby High School Invitational golf tournament on Thursday leading the Cowboys to a third-place finish out of the 10-team field.

Linin shot a three-over-par 75 for 18 holes finishing two strokes behind the tournament's champion Sean Mengel of Colby.

Freshman T.J. Hawkins shot an 86 with senior Derrick Raymer just one stroke behind. Sophomore Jacob Erickson finished with a 96. Both senior David Livengood and sophomore Mikey Doll shot a 103.

The Eagles of Colby, the host team, won the tournament with a team score of 313. The Eagles placed five players among the top 10. The Norton Blue Jays were sec-

ond scoring 339 with Goodland seven strokes back. Hoxie was fourth with 349, one stroke better than Oakley.

The tournament was played at the Colby Country Club's par-36 nine-hole course.

Coach Jon McLean said he was pleased with the way the team has been playing better as the season progressed and that the Cowboys appear to be reaching their peak performance in time for the Northwest Kansas League tournament on Friday and the regional tournament next Monday.

The Cowboys will be the host team for the league tournament which starts at 2 p.m. at the Sugar Hills Golf Club.
