# Boys third in Colby

Senior Lane Winter led the Cowboys to a third-place finish at Friday's track meet in Colby.

Winter won the 200-meter dash with a time of 22.68 seconds. He also cleared 5 feet 10 inches to place second in the high jump and ran the 100-meter dash in 11.18 seconds to finish in a tie for second.

Winter teamed up with seniors Bret Jarmin and Wade Taylor along with freshman Casey Henderson to place second in the 4x100-meter relay running it in 44.92 seconds.

Jarmin was second in the javelin with a throw of 165 feet 7 inches. He also placed sixth in both the 100meter dash and the discus. Taylor placed fifth in the 400-meter dash and the triple jump, and also competed in the javelin. Henderson took fifth in the 100-meter dash and shot put, and also ran the 200-meter

Sophomore Kerek Mason placed second in the 1,600-meter run finishing in 4 minutes 47.83 seconds. a personal best.


