For families dealing with divorce, remarriage, custody and child visitations, summer can hold additional challenges.

Many parents come to dread making such arrangements and transfers of children from one to the other, and the children certainly don't find any enjoyment in the conflicts either.

Good communication between all the adults involved and a willingness to work together for the good of the children is vital.

Children's feelings about visitations vary depending on their relationship with the non-custodial parent, stepfamily issues and their own interests in how they want to spend their time.

Planning ahead is important. Often the anxiety involved comes from not knowing what is going to happen, so parents need to talk about summer plans with the children as early as possible.

For children who are eagerly anticipating the visit, the custodial parents needs to be supportive and avoid comments that make the child feel guilty about being happy.

Provide a calendar to mark off the days until the trip. Help with packing and include a list of addresses and phone numbers for children to make contact with parents, relatives and friends. Send the children off with encouragement and a smile.

When the young visitor arrives, the non-custodial parent and family should allow some time for adjustment to the new surroundings, household rules and expectations.

Give the child his own room if possible or at least his own closet space and storage area for clothing and other items.

Help the child get acquainted with the area, if he is not already, by providing a map of the neighborhood, addresses and phone numbers and taking a tour of the community.

Parents should also encourage their children to keep regular contact with the other parent through phone calls, letters and e-mails.

Summer visitations don't have to be times of dread if parents maintain a working relationship with each other in regards to the child. And children can relax and enjoy their time with both parents when they feel encouraged and accepted.
