in Colby. Senior Kara Angelos ran a careerbest 15.9 seconds to place second in the 100-meter high hurdles, qualifying for state.

She also ran the second leg of the 4x100-meter relay for the Cowgirls.

The preliminary heats for the 100 hurdles will be held around 2 p.m. (Mountain Time) Friday with the finals scheduled for 10:10 a.m. Sat-

Sophomore Emily Murray qualified for state by finishing second in the 300-meter low hurdles with a season-best time of 48.6 seconds.

She also ran the 100-meter hurdles and the third leg on the 4x100 relay team. Coach Don Smith said Murray

was leading in the finals of the 300 but clipped the last hurdle. The preliminaries of the 300-


