

Three Cowgirls head to state track meet

The Cowgirls will send three athletes to the state track and field meet Friday at Cessna Stadium in Wichita after finishing 10th among 16 teams at Friday's regional meet in Colby.

Senior Kara Angelos ran a career-best 15.9 seconds to place second in the 100-meter high hurdles, qualifying for state.

She also ran the second leg of the 4x100-meter relay for the Cowgirls.

The preliminary heats for the 100 hurdles will be held around 2 p.m. (Mountain Time) Friday with the finals scheduled for 10:10 a.m. Saturday.

Sophomore Emily Murray qualified for state by finishing second in the 300-meter low hurdles with a season-best time of 48.6 seconds.

She also ran the 100-meter hurdles and the third leg on the 4x100 relay team.

Coach Don Smith said Murray was leading in the finals of the 300 but clipped the last hurdle.

The preliminaries of the 300-meter hurdles start around 4:40 p.m. on Friday, with the finals around 4:45 p.m. Saturday.

Junior Tiffany Thomas passed another runner in the final 120 meters of the 1,600-meter run to finish fourth and earn a spot at the state meet.

Her time was 5 minutes 55.3 seconds.

"I'm extremely happy for Tiffany," Smith said. "She ran a great last lap and now has the opportunity to run in the state meet."

Thomas also competed in the 800-meter run for the Cowgirls.

The 1,600-meter run will start around 1:40 p.m. on Saturday. Following the last boys race at that distance, the Hall of Fame presentations will be made.

Other top six finishers for the Cowgirls in Colby were sophomores Stephanie Sheldon and Kaylee Billinger.

Sheldon cleared a season-best 8 feet, 6 inches to finish in a three-way tie for sixth in the pole vault.

Billinger placed sixth in the 100-meter dash in 13.1 seconds. She also ran in the preliminaries of the 200

meters, finishing in 27.19 seconds. Both were season-best times.

She also ran the anchor leg of the 4x100.

Junior Lisha Tedford competed in both the shot put and discus. Sophomore Dani Bedore made the final flight in both the long and triple jumps but did not place.

Bedore ran the first leg of the 4x100.

The Lady Indians of Andale won the girls team trophy with 96 points.

Buhler was second with 84 and Clearwater third with 65. Colby finished fourth with 55 points and will send athletes to state in three individual events and two relay races.

The Lady Eagles' 4x400 relay team won, finishing in 4 minutes 10.7 seconds.

Jessie Stephens placed second in both the 1,600 and 3,200-meter runs and ran a leg for the Lady Eagles' second-place 4x800-meter relay team.

Andrea Barker earned a trip to Wichita by placing third in the 100-meter dash. She also placed fifth in the 200-meter dash and was a member of Colby's 4x100-meter relay team, which finished fifth.

Colby's Lissa Mazanec placed second in the discus with a throw of 118 feet. She placed sixth in the shot put.

Zanae Baird earned two points for the Eagles, finishing fifth in the 3,200-meter run.



Bulldogs finish sixth in Oakley

The Brewster High School boys finished sixth out of 27 teams at the state Class 1A regional track meet Friday in Oakley, while the girls finished 16th.

Leading the Bulldogs was Jonathan Collett, who won the 3,200-meter run in 10 minutes, 33.6 seconds to qualify for the state meet Friday and Saturday in Wichita.

Teammate Karman Selby placed fifth in 11 minutes 7.7 seconds.

Selby qualified for state in the 800-meter run, placing second with a time of 2 minutes 4.8 seconds.

Mark Luckert was sixth in the 1,600-meter run in 5 minutes 9.3 seconds.

Both the Bulldogs' 4x800 and 4x400-meter relay teams qualified for state.

The 4x800 team won, finishing in

8 minutes, 38.2 seconds, while the 4x400 team ran its race in 3 minutes, 33.7 seconds to place second.

Pawnee Heights High of Rozel won the boys' trophy with 53 points.

Greeley County High of Tribune was second with 51.25, followed by Hanston with 43 and La Crosse with 42. Brewster had 39 points.

Wallace County High of Sharon Springs earned 20 points to finish in a tie for 13th with Grinnell.

Taylor Elder of Wallace County won the 1,600-meter run in 4 minutes, 47.6 seconds, and his teammate Kevin Heyl cleared 12 feet, 6 inches to win the pole vault.

Amy Carpenter earned 10 of the Brewster girls' 11 points by winning the shot put with a heave of 37 feet 6.75 inches.

Megan Allen got the other point for the Lady Bulldogs, leaping 15 feet, 7 inches to place sixth in the long jump.

Ness City won the girls' competition with 60 points, followed by Claflin with 50.

Wallace County finished in a tie for 10th with Jetmore, both teams scoring 26 points.

Bracey Fischer and Nikki Welsh both cleared 8 feet, 6 inches to finish "one-two" in the pole vault for Wallace County. Fischer had fewer

misses than Welsh.

Chricket Short cleared 4 feet, 10 inches for second place in the high jump.

All three qualify for state.

All six classes of Kansas high school athletics will hold their state meets at Cessna Stadium, 21st Street and Hillsdale, in Wichita this weekend.

Action starts with the field events at 7 a.m. (Mountain Time) on Friday. The awards ceremony will be held around 7:45 p.m. Saturday.

Ex-Cowgirls golfer takes 36th spot at national tourney

Freshman Jessica Osborn of Dodge City Community College placed 36th out of 82 players at the National Junior College Athletic Association's national golf championships last week in Daytona Beach, Fla.

The four-day tournament was held at the par-72 Ladies Professional Golf Association International course.

Each of the 12 teams had five players competing. Each player shot a round of 18 holes each day for four consecutive days, May 16-19. The best four scores among the five on each day were totaled for the team's score for that day.

Osborn shot a 26-over-par 98 on the first day but improved with an 87 the second day and an 86 on the third. On the final day, she again shot an 87 for a four-day total 358. Sophomore Emma Taylor placed

15th with score of 331 to lead the Lady Conquistadors. Sophomore Charity Maune finished 48th with 370, freshman Lauren Williams 60th with 389 and sophomore Rae Ann Williams was 62nd with 395.

Dodge City finished seventh with a team score of 1,443. Daytona Beach Community College won its third straight title with 1,249. Four of the team's players finished in the top 12.

Camila Sola of Redlands Community College of Oklahoma won the tournament with a four-day score of 287.

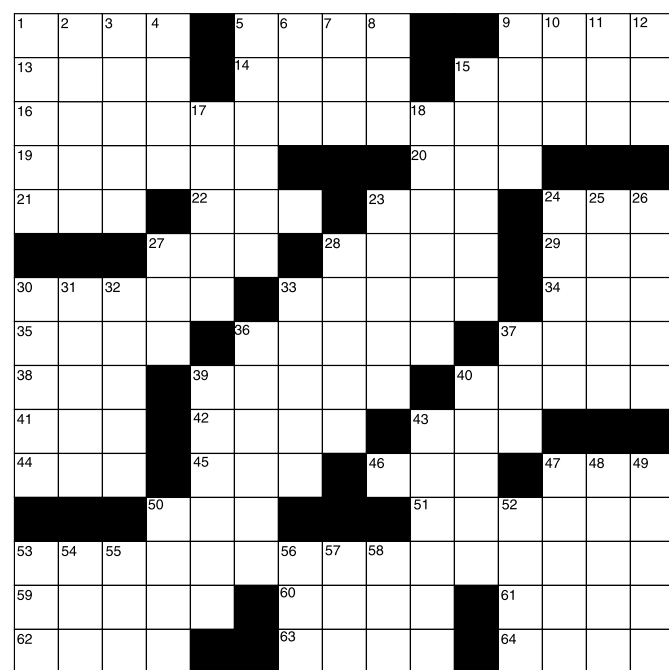
She had the best round of the championship with a 3-under-par 69 on day one. Kristy McLaughlin of Daytona Beach was second with 303.
