Water Testing—The Northwest Local Environmental Protection Group does well evaluations, including testing for bacteria and nitrates. To schedule an evaluation or discuss environmental concerns, call the Health Department at 899-4888.

The group charges a \$50 letter of intent fee (similar to a permit) which is good for one year. It is required on the installation or modification of all septic systems in the protection group’s area.

The group will continue to offer free testing to private individuals. However, if you are selling, purchasing or refinancing any property that requires an inspection, the group will charge a \$90 inspection fee. The inspection includes site evaluations on well and septic systems and testing the water. The group will also charge a \$25 fee for child care and foster care inspections.

Bob Boehme

Robert Eugene Boehme, 67, Emporia, a 1955 Sherman Community High School graduate, died Saturday, May 28, 2005, at Newman Regional Health in Emporia.

He was born Aug. 4, 1937, at Spearville, the son of Clifford and Sarah (Mack) Boehme. As a boy, he enjoyed farming. During his high school years, he worked for the Goodland Clothing Company.

On Aug. 25, 1957, he married Sharilyn McDaniel at Goodland. They later divorced. She is now Sharilyn Toussaint and lives in Montgomery, Ala.

On March 22, 1991, he married Judith Jones Yearout at the Westminster United Presbyterian Church in Emporia.

Boehme attended the University of Kansas on an ROTC scholarship. During summers while in college, he worked for the Rock Island Railroad. After graduating from the university, he entered service with the Air Force, from which he retired as a lieutenant colonel.

During his service, he was stationed in Vietnam, Thailand, the Pentagon and in Korea with combined forces of Korea and the United States. He also served as a navigator/bombardier with the Strategic Air Command on B-52 bombers and held several staff positions.

Following his retirement from the service, Boehme returned to Goodland to his love of farming, and he also sold farm equipment for a John Deere dealership. In 1995, he moved to Emporia, where he worked at the Lyon County Courthouse, Admire Bank and Trust Company and was especially fond of his work as a mentor at Walnut Elementary School.

Boehme was a member of the American Legion Post and Veterans of Foreign Wars, both in Goodland, and had served as a past commander

at the VFW.

In Emporia, he was a member of the VFW and the American Legion and had served as a past commander of the American Legion. He was a member of the Emporia Masonic Lodge and the Arab Shrine Temple in Topeka. He was also a member of the Shrine Cartoons Unit and the Fraternal Order of the Eagles Aerie, both in Emporia.

He grew up as a member of the St. Paul’s Episcopal Church in Goodland and attended the Westminster United Presbyterian Church in Emporia.

Preceding him in death were his parents and a brother, Bill Boehme. Survivors include his wife; a son, Robert Lynn Boehme of Birmingham, Ala.; a daughter, Cynthia Boehme Smith of Chattanooga, Tenn.; two step-sons, Chris Yearout of Emporia and Doug Yearout of Lee’s Summit, Mo.; a step-daughter, Cynthia Lewis of Emporia; a sister, Marilyn (Arnold) Schindler of Brewster; 10 grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

Services will be at 9 a.m. Mountain Time Wednesday, June 1, 2005, at Roberts-Blue-Barnett Funeral Home in Emporia with Pastor James T. Akers, national chaplain of the American Legion, officiating.

Moran taking service accademy applications

Rep. Jerry Moran is accepting applications for nominations to the U.S. service academies for the 2006-2007 academic year.

The academies include the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y.; the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md.; the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs; and the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, N.Y. The U.S.

Coast Guard Academy uses a different process.

To be eligible for a nomination from Moran, an applicant must be a U.S. citizen, a legal resident of Kansas and age 17-23 as of July 1 of the year of admission. Applicants must be unmarried, not pregnant and not legally obligated to support any dependents.

Selection is based on grade average, class rank, college entrance examination scores, school records, extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, leadership potential, motivation and interview evaluations.

Deadline is Oct. 1. To get an application, write to Congressman Jerry Moran, Attn: Service Acad-

emy Selection, Box 1128, Hutchinson, Kan. 67504-1128.

If nominated, the applicant must meet admission requirements of the academies, which will make the final decision. Due to limited placement and the competitiveness of the process, Moran recommends applicants also apply to Sen. Pat Roberts and Sam Brownback.
