Water Testing — The Northwest Local Environmental Protection Group does well evaluations, including testing for bacteria and nitrates. To schedule an evaluation or discuss environmental concerns, call the Health Department at 899-4888.

The group charges a \$50 letter of intent fee (similar to a permit) which is good for one year. It is required on the installation or modification of all septic systems in the protection group's area.

The group will continue to offer free testing to private individuals. However, if you are selling, purchasing or refinancing any property that requires an inspection, the group will charge a \$90 inspection fee. The inspection includes site evaluations on well and septic systems and testing the water. The group will also charge a \$25 fee for child care and foster care inspections.

Man sold 380 acres, made \$4,500 for farm today in history

Sherman County Historical Society June 7, 1905: The north half of section 30-8-39 and 60 acres of the southwest of section 19-3-39, 380 acres in all, sold by Jake Lemmer at almost \$15 per acre.

He received \$4,500 net to him for the property. This improved farm is situated just south of the Rock Island track and yards in Goodland.

Mr. Lemmer, in speaking of the sale, said that he turned over the deeds the same hour of the day that he filed homestead papers upon the northeast quarter twenty years ago.

He has held it through prosperity and hard time alike, having added the other tracts to it. He has another farm of 320 acres about 13 miles north of Goodland, which Jake will also sell when he gets his price.

With that gone, this pioneer will be landless but not moneyless. He has spent the best years of his life here and says that he intends to die here. He wouldn't exchange ety.
