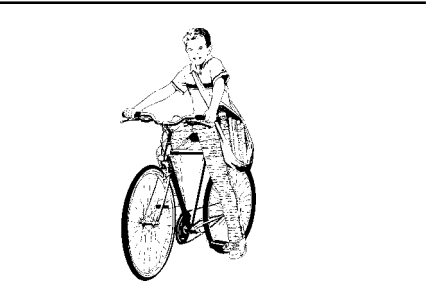

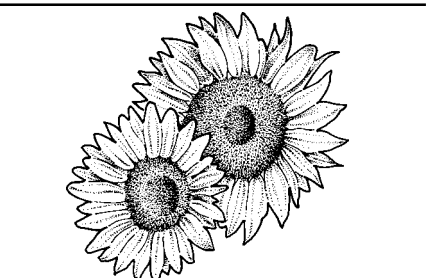

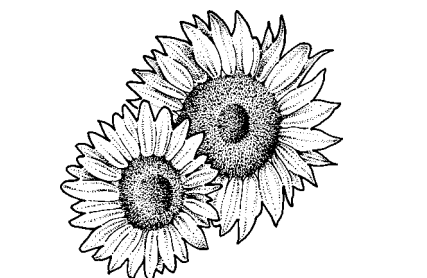

Students close year with spring concert, awards ceremony

So sang the Men's Chorale to open the Goodland High School Vocal Music Department Spring Program last month.

The Black and Gold Choir, Les Chantes and X-Pressos also performed, and several students had solos. The music ranged from "Luck Be a Lady" to "Ahrirang," a Korean folk song.

Before the final performance, the school's singing stars received awards from the Kansas Music Educators Association (KMEA) and awards for the school's musical, "Camelot;" regional piano; state piano; regional contest; letters for music; and music student of the year. Margaret Martin Piano Award went to Langness, who was also music student of the year.

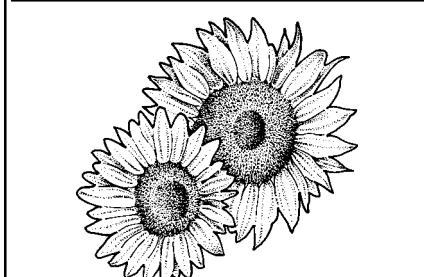
