

Legion team loses to Colby, Burlington

The Goodland American Legion baseball team fell to 0-4 for the season Tuesday after losing to Colby 10-0 and to Burlington 16-7 at a three-team triple header at Memorial Field.

In the top of the first inning of the opening game, Colby sent all nine of its batters to the plate, scoring four runs on three hits. After holding Goodland to a "three and out," Colby sent eight batters to the plate in the top of the second, picking up three more runs for a 7-0 lead.

Goodland suffered another "three and out" in the bottom of the second.

In the top of the third, Colby again sent eight to the plate, getting another three runs to make the score 10-0. In the bottom of the inning, Goodland's Andrew Pettibone got on base with a walk but Colby's defense got the next three batters out to leave him stranded.

Neither team scored in the fourth, and the game ended by rule.

In the second game, Burlington defeated Colby in a 15-12 slugfest. Goodland took on Burlington in the final game of the night, taking a 3-0 lead in the first. Pitcher Jared Doke started things off by striking out Burlington's first batter. After the second batter made it on base, the next one grounded out to the pitcher for the second out. Doke got his second strikeout to retire the side.

In the bottom of the inning,

Randy Young got things going for Goodland by getting on with a walk. A pair of miscues by Burlington allowed him to get to third. Wyatt Dautel hit a single through the gap between third and shortstop, driving in Young.

Burlington got the next two Goodland batters, but Dautel was able to get to third. Derek Fenner then hit a single through the same gap, driving in Dautel for a 2-0 Goodland lead. On the next pitch,

Fenner stole second. He got to third on a passed ball. Next up was Jake Johnson, who hit a fly ball to left field which the Burlington player missed, allowing Fenner to score.

Goodland's next batter struck out, but the home team took a 3-0 lead into the second inning.

Goodland's defense again shut out Burlington in the top of the second, getting three of four batters out and stranding one on base.

In the bottom of the inning,

Goodland was able to load the bases as Preston Dautel got on with a single, followed by Young's second walk and a single by Wyatt Dautel. Jake Alander then hit a single to deep left, driving in Preston Dautel and keeping the bases loaded.

Young scored on a throwing error when the Burlington pitcher tried to pick off the runner on first. Doke hit a single, driving in Wyatt Dautel, but Alander was forced out at second. Doke was picked off at first for the third out, but Goodland now led 6-0.

In the third inning, the game's momentum started to change.

Burlington was able to score a pair of runs in the top of the inning, then held Goodland scoreless in the bottom.

In the top of the fourth, Burling-

ton scored its third run on a throwing error, then managed to load the bases.

The next batter hit a double to deep left, driving in three runners and tying the game at 6. In the bottom of the inning, Burlington's defense again held firm.

In the top of the fifth, Burlington scored twice, taking an 8-6 lead. Later in the inning, Burlington loaded the bases, after which Goodland made a pitching change, bringing in Alander.

Soon after the change, Johnson, playing first, came up with an unassisted double play, followed by Alander's first strikeout to end the scoring threat.

Burlington then held Goodland scoreless for the third straight inning.

The sixth inning proved to be a scoring bonanza for Burlington, though, as its players came up with eight runs to make it 16-6.

Burlington was able to load the bases eight times in the inning.

In the bottom of the inning, Goodland scored when Alander hit a triple to deep left center, driving in Wyatt Dautel. However, that was all Burlington would give up, leaving the score 16-7 and ending the game by rule.

The next home action for Goodland starts at 2 p.m. Sunday at Memorial Field for a doubleheader against Gove County.

The players travel to Norton next Thursday for a doubleheader, after which the team will have an eight-day break before the Levi Hayden Tournament here on June 24-26.
