

Swim team takes fourth

The Goodland swim team had its best outing of the season last Saturday in Burlington, placing fourth and winning gold medals in seven individual events and four relays.

Gerell Miller took first in three events in the 8-and-under boys competition. He won the 25-yard freestyle in 21.14 seconds, the 50-yard freestyle in 53.37 and the 25-yard breaststroke in 27.50.

Miller also swam legs in two winning 8-and-under mixed relays. He teamed up with Alex Goodwin, Alicia Barrie and Drew House to win the 100-yard freestyle relay in 2 minutes. 3.98 seconds. Miller and House got with Kelsey White and Rachel Horney to win the 100-yard medley relay in 2:16.69.

Riley O'Harah won the 11-12 boys 50- and 100-yard freestyles in 30.99 and 1:13.63. He placed third in the 50-yard breaststroke.

Daniel Blake won the 15-18 boys 100-yard freestyle in 59.78 and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:17.6. He placed second in the 50-yard freestyle in 27.13.

Berkley White, Drew Dautel, Taryn Bedore and Ian Bonsall won the 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle relay in 1:18.9. In the 13-14 girls category, Alexis Bateman, Hannah Blake, Chelsey Horney and Cassie Cooper teamed to win the 200-yard medley relay in 2:58.26.

Kerek Mason placed second in the 15-18 boys 100-yard freestyle in 1:02.91. He finished third in the 50-yard freestyle and was fourth in the 100-yard breaststroke.

Holton Witman placed second in the 9-10 boys 25-yard freestyle in 16.4 and was third in the 25-yard backstroke.

Hannah Blake swam the 13-14 girls 100-yard freestyle in 1:10.41 to place second. She finished third in the 50-yard freestyle.

In the 8-and-under boys competition, Drew House finished third in two events: the 50-yard freestyle and the 25-yard breaststroke. He was sixth in the 25-yard freestyle.

Zach Miller placed fourth in the 9-10 boys 25-yard breaststroke and the 100-yard individual medley. He was fifth in the 25-yard butterfly.

Ian Bonsall finished fourth in the 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle and sixth in the 25-yard butterfly.

Erik Roeder finished fourth in the 13-14 boys 100-yard backstroke.

Alex Goodwin placed fifth in both the 8-and-under boys 25- and 50-yard freestyle races, and sixth in the 25-yard backstroke.

Other fifth-place performances for Goodland were Shayley Miller in the 9-10 girls 25-yard breaststroke and Austin Rains in the 9-10 boys 25-yard backstroke.

Sixth-place finishes were turned in by Tanner O'Harah, in the 13-14 boys 50 and 100-yard freestyle; Colton Cooper, in the 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle; Chelsey Horney, in the 13-14 girls 100-yard backstroke; and by Halli Stone, in

the 15-18 girls 100-yard backstroke.

In other relays, Goodland finished second in three and third in two. The team also earned a fourth, fifth and sixth-place finish.

In the 9-10 boys competition, Zach Miller, Caleb Wallsmith, Holton Witman and Colton Cooper placed second in the 100-yard freestyle relay in 1:23.6. Miller, Witman and Cooper teamed with Holden Hoover to take second in the 100-yard medley relay finishing in 1:45.23.

Ellie House, Drew Dautel, Chloe Goodwin and Ian Bonsall placed second in the 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley relay in 1:44.09.

Halli Stone, Kerek Mason, Daniel Blake and Toby Hurst placed third in two 15-18 mixed relays: the 200-yard freestyle and 200-yard medley.

Placing fourth in the 8-and-under 100-yard freestyle relay were Rachel Horney, Sianna Miller, Carrie Cooper and Ashley Barrie. Shayley Miller, Ellie House, Chloe Goodwin and Brianna White were fifth in the 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle relay. Berkley White, Taryn Bedore, Shayley Miller and Brianna White finished sixth in the 100-yard medley relay.

Others competing for Goodland were Paetyn Barricklow, Brooke Lockhart, Johanna Gruskin and Madison Hoover.

Colby won the meet with 349.5 points. Burlington was second with 211.5 followed by Holyoke with 211. Goodland's score was 124.

The next Northwest Kansas Swim League meet will be Saturday in Colby.
