

# Two swimmers win gold at Colby meet

## Swim team takes home 12 firsts

Two Goodland swimmers won three individual gold medals at the Northwest Kansas Swim League meet in Colby on Saturday.

The team captured 12 firsts in age-ranked competitions, with the top swimmer collecting four gold medals.

In the 13-14 year old boys competition, Brennan Clouse won the 50-yard freestyle in 26.65 seconds, the 100-yard freestyle in 1 minute, 2.06 seconds and the 200-yard freestyle in 2:21.87.

Clouse also swam a leg in the

winning 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay.

Daniel Blake won three gold medals in the 15-18 boys bracket.

He took the 100-yard freestyle in 58.22, the 200-yard freestyle in 2:14.66 and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:16.75.

Riley O'Harah earned a pair of gold medals, winning the 11-12 boys 50- and 100-yard freestyle races.

His times were 31.56 and 1:11.63. O'Harah also placed third in the 50-yard breaststroke.

Gerrell Miller won the 8-and-under boys 25-yard backstroke in 27.31.

He was second in the 25-yard breaststroke it in 25.04. Miller teamed with Ashley Barrie, Alex Goodwin and Drew House to finish second in the mixed 100-yard

freestyle relay in 1:54.19. Miller, Goodwin and House got with Rachel Horney to place second in the mixed 100-yard medley relay.

Hannah Blake swam the 13-14 girls 100-yard freestyle in 1:09.05 to finish in a tie for first.

She was third at 200 yards.

Blake and Clouse teamed up with Alexis Bateman and Tanner O'Harah to win the gold in the 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay in 2:11.44. Blake, Bateman and O'Harah got with Erik Roeder to place second in the mixed 200-yard medley relay in 2:45.81.

In the 8-and-under boys competition, Drew House finished second in the 25-yard freestyle in 24.19 and second at 50 yards in 55.5.

He was fourth in the 25-yard breaststroke.

Alex Goodwin placed fifth in the 25-yard breaststroke.

Zach Miller placed second in the 9-10 boys 25-yard breaststroke in 23.64.

He also finished third in the 25-yard individual medley and sixth in the 25-yard butterfly.

Zach Miller teamed up with Austin Rains, Holton Witman and Ian Bonsall to win the boys 100-yard medley relay in 1:35.2.

Miller and Witman teamed up with Caleb Wallsmith and Holden Hoover to place second in the 100-yard freestyle relay in 1:23.72.

Toby Hurst finished second in the 15-18 boys 50-yard freestyle in 34.31 and was third at 100 yards.

In the 9-10 boys competition, Holton Witman placed third in the 25-yard freestyle, 25-yard backstroke and the 25-yard butterfly.

Ian Bonsall was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle and Drew Dautel was sixth in the 25-yard breaststroke.

For 9-10 girls, Chloe Goodwin, Brooke Lockhart, Taryn Bedore and Brianna White placed fifth in the 100-yard freestyle relay.

Shayley Miller, Shycol Woodrow, Berkley White and Ellie House placed sixth.

Shyley Miller, Ellie House, Brianna White and Bedore joined to take sixth in the girls 100-yard medley relay.

Woodrow, Dautel, Chloe Goodwin and Berkley White were sixth in the mixed 100-yard medley relay.

Rachel Horney placed third in the 8-and-under girls 100-yard individual medley and was sixth in the 25-yard butterfly.

She teamed up with Kelsey White, Sianna Miller and Alicia Barrie to place sixth in the 100-yard freestyle relay.

In the 13-14 boys bracket, Erik Roeder placed fourth in the 200-

yard freestyle and Tanner O'Harah was fifth at 100 yards.

Parker Sieck placed fifth in the 11-12 boys 100-yard freestyle and Kassarah Woodrow was sixth in the 11-12 girls 50-yard breaststroke.

Sieck teamed with Abby Jolly, Riley O'Harah and Johanna Gruskin to finish fourth in the mixed 200-yard medley relay. Gruskin and Jolly teamed with Madison Hoover and Kassarah Woodrow to place fourth in the girls 200-yard freestyle relay.

Other Goodland swimmers competing were Paetyn Barriclow, Hagen Hoss and Caleb Rains.

Team scores were not available at press time.

Steever Water Park will be the venue for the next league meet on Saturday. The league championships will be the following weekend in Oakley.

# Former Cowboys gear up for college football

## Two teams welcome new players

The college football season begins in less than two months, and this year there will be plenty of former Goodland Cowboys taking the field.

At least two teams will have two Goodland High graduates on the roster.

One of those is the Broncbusters of Garden City Community College, where both David Livengood and Derrick Raymer signed in February.

Last season, Garden City finished 6-4 overall and 4-3 in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. The Broncbusters ended the regular season 5-3, then defeated Dodge City Community

College in the first round of the conference playoffs. A week later, they lost to Butler County Community College.

Garden City, under first-year coach J.J. Eckert, opens its campaign with a home game against Fort Scott Community College on Saturday, Aug. 27. After that, the Broncbusters have a pair of road games: against Independence Community College on

Sept. 3 and Cisco Junior College (Texas) a week later for a non-conference contest.

On Sept. 17, the team returns to Memorial Stadium in Garden City to face Butler County, followed by a trip to Dodge City on Sept. 24.

October begins with a home game against Highland Community College on the 1st, with a road trip to Coffeyville on the 8th. The Broncbusters end the regular season with a home game against the Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College on Oct. 15.

Jared Doke, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, was a backup quar-

terback for Hutchinson last season and is expected to see a lot more action in 2005.

All eight Kansas Jayhawk teams will compete in the first round of the conference playoffs on Oct. 23, followed a week later by the second round. The championship game will be Nov. 6.

Both Livengood and Raymer won all-league first team honors as seniors last year from the Northwest Kansas League, Livengood as a wide receiver, and Raymer as quarterback and punter. Raymer also took second team honors as a linebacker and kicker.

Other first team all-league selections joining the ex-Cowboys in Garden City are Matt Smith of Oakley and Tanner Kinnen of St. Francis.

Another college football team with a pair of Goodland High alumni is Kansas State University, where Don Raymer, class of 2003, and Jordan Bedore, class of 2004, are on the roster. Don Raymer, Derrick's older brother, played his first two seasons at Garden City, transferring to K-State in January. Bedore was a redshirt last year.

The Wildcats open their season on Sept. 3 with a home game against Florida International University.
