Kansas drivers under the age of 18 are now being issued a driver's license that is vertical and has a green bar under the photo.

Kansas state law prohibits the sale of cigarettes and tobacco products to youth under 18 years of age.

The fine for selling tobacco products to anyone *under 18* is **\$1,000**. That's in addition to a \$250 fine to the clerk for making the sale.
