or more to get the plants moved from Minnesota and rebuilt at the new location, which is about five miles west of K-27.

The commissioners talked about the impact the development will have on the city-county road project, and suggested the city look at adopting the one cent sales tax they have available to get the project moving ahead and to avoid having to go to the state Legislature.

Rasure asked what businesses there were outside the city that might not be included in a city sales tax.

Tiede and Thomas listed things in Edson and Kanorado and agreed that much of what outside the city was exempt because the businesses supported farming with supplies.

In other business the commissioners:

- Set the next meet for Wednesday, July 27, to meet with bond counsel to discuss issuing bonds to repair the courthouse and Southwest Bell building, build a storage building behind the courthouse and pay for the county's share of the replacement of a bridge on County Road 65 (Eighth Street) west of the turn to Sugar Hills Golf Club.

Volk said these are updated annually with changes made by the state Legislature.

- Hiring a city attorney with City Attorney Perry Warren retiring Aug. 1.
- Announcement that Adronics will have a grand opening Tuesday at 11 a.m.
- The annual street sealing program, which begins on Wednesday.

County Clerk Janet Rumpel said she had spoken to the bond attorney about the possibility of adding the road project.

- Heard an update on the next Household Hazardous Waste collection, which is from 7-11 a.m. Saturday morning.

Tiede said Fire Chief Kenny Griffith was looking for some help because several of his regular helpers will be out of town at a training program.

- Talked to Lloyd Holbrook of the Sherman County Historical Society about the society budget, and the nomination for the Southwest Bell building for the National Register of Historic Places.

Rumpel said the county cannot increase the .2 mill levy given to the society, but that it would show an increase because of the more than \$4 million increase in valuation this year.

Holbrook said that would help the society's painting program.

He said he was willing to help do the preparation for the nominator for the Southwest Bell building, and asked if the commissioners could make a donation to the society and the Ennis-Handy House to pay for the effort. The commissioners agreed to discuss a donation and

asked Holbrook to keep track of the number of hours that it takes to get the material ready to send to Topeka.

- Had an update from Tiede about the musk thistle problem brought up at the July 5 meeting by Kent Willems. Tiede said he had talked to Daryl West, head of the noxious weed department, and that West had been to most of the locations on a list Willems had presented.

- Heard that the county agenda and the minutes are now being posted on the updated county web site www.sherman.kansasgov.com.

Thomas suggested adding insulation in a small room where it was so cold, and Rasure talked about adding some insulation to reduce the cold transfer through the cement block walls. Butts said he would get some estimates on the cost of materials, and that he could probably do some of the work with his people.

The commissioners agreed to let Tiede review the mid-month vouchers and hold any he had a question about. The meeting adjourned at 9:50 a.m.

- Updates on recent motor problems, including a blower motor out at the sewer plant; a pump burned out at city well No. 7, 1625 Colorado; and an air-conditioning at the Federal Aviation Administration office at the airport.

The commissioners held a closed meeting Monday to review city manager applicants they have interviewed.

No decisions were announced, but the commissioners requested additional information from the

Kansas League of Municipalities.

The commissioners have interviewed about seven candidates, and Tom Armour, interim manager, said they are looking at possibly three of those, but have not reached a decision.

The city commission meets at 5 p.m. in the commission room on the second floor of the City Administration Building 204 W. 11th.

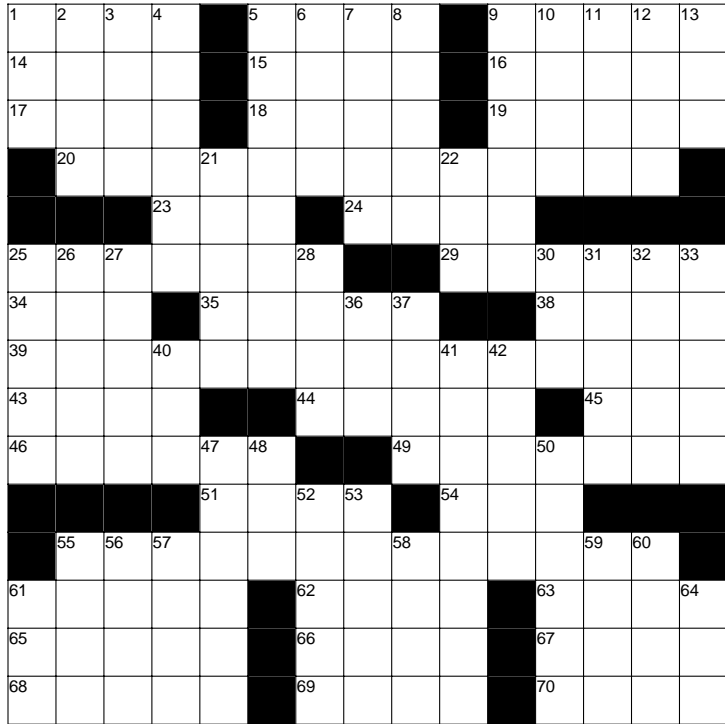
