AN ORDINANCE REGULAT-ING THE TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, **KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STAN-**DARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDI-**TION OF 2005; PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND** AMENDING AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1522.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KAN-SAS:

SECTION 1. INCOR-PORATING THE STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Goodland, Kansas, that certain Standard Traffic Ordinance known as the Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2005, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. AN ORDINANCE REGULAT-ING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS: IN-**CORPORATING BY REFER-ENCE THE "UNIFORM PUB-**LIC OFFENSE CODE FOR **KANSAS CITIES," EDITION** OF 2005; PROVIDING CER-TAIN PENALTIES AND AMENDING AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1521.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INCOR-PORATING UNIFORM PUB-LIC OFFENCE CODE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Goodland, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code," Edition of 2005, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Uniform Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 1533," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be opened to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.

SECTION 2. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 1521 is hereby amended and repealed.

SECTION 3. EFFEC-TIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official City Newspaper.
