AN ORDINANCE ATTESTING TO AN INCREASE IN TAX REVENUES FOR BUDGET YEAR 2006 FOR THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS.

WHEREAS, the City of Goodland, Kansas must continue to provide services to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this community; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing essential services to the citizens of this city continues to increase; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Legislature has eliminated demand transfers to local governments; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Legislature failed to reinstate these demand transfer payments to local governments; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Legislature has failed to provide local governments with authority to raise necessary revenue from the City of Goodland, Kansas.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Goodland, Kansas:

Section 1. In accordance with Mary P. Volk, City Clerk state law the City of Goodland, Kansas has conducted a public hearing and has published the proposed budget necessary to fund city services from January 1, 2006 until December 31, 2006.

Section 2. After careful public deliberations, the governing body has determined that in order to maintain the public services, which are essential for the citizens of this city, it will be necessary to budget property tax revenue in an amount, which exceeds the 2005 budget.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect after publication once in the official city newspaper.
