## Former governors admit they caused budget woes

Former state governors agree decisions they made led to budget problems and increased property taxes in a new film to be shown on Smoky Hills Public Television "The Kansas Governor," a new documentary, is scheduled to air at 6 p.m. Mountain Time on Thursday, on Smoky Hills Public Television (Channel 2).

Gov. Bill Graves says the big tax cuts during his tenure led to some of the state's current budget problems.

Gov. Mike Hayden had control of Kansas politics when the state overhauled its property tax system. Taxes went up for thousands of Kansans, and Hayden says it cost him re-election.

Twenty years earlier, Gov. Bill Avery helped impose the income withholding tax for the first time in Kansas. He says that, too, made him a one-term governor.

Believed to be the only film in any state of its extent, the documentary was produced by Washburn University political science professor Bob Beatty. Beatty interviewed all five living former Kansas gov-

ernors—Graves, Hayden, Gov. John Carlin, Avery and Gov. John Anderson—as well as Gov. Kathleen Sebelius.

Beatty got the idea for the documentary following the deaths of former governors Robert Bennett in 2000 and Joan Finney in 2001. Beatty said he learned then that no one had done an extensive interview with the state's first woman governor.

"I wanted a historical record and to reveal a bit of their personalities," Beatty said.

In addition to the six living governors of Kansas, Beatty interviewed other politicians and former Associated Press reporter Lew Ferguson, who covered the Statehouse from 1970 to 1999.

Washburn University and the Center for Kansas Studies paid for the project. ADVD of the film will be sent to every state high school for use in government and history classes.

leader, Norbert Dreiling had advised prominent politicians from John F. Kennedy (he chaired his Kansas campaigns) to Kansas Govs. George and Robert Docking.

His brother Tom was editor of *The Goodland Daily News* for many years and now is publisher of the *Colby Free Press*.

Dreiling was born April 7, 1925, in Gorham to Richard A. and Mollie (Eichman) Dreiling. He graduated from St. Joseph Military Academy, Fort Hays State University and the Washburn University Law School.

On Aug. 18, 1948, he married Donna Jean Myerly in Hays.

He was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church and the Third Degree Knights of Columbus and Fourth Degree Bishop Cunningham Assembly Knights of Columbus, all of Hays.

Dreiling was senior partner in the law firm of Dreiling, Bieker and Hoffman. He served two terms as Ellis County attorney. He was state Democratic party chairman from 1966 to 1974 and led several delegations to national conventions.
