• Approved a bid from Sporer Land Development of Oakley for \$238,539 to do safety improvement on the north end of the main runway at the city airport. Engineer Darin Neufeld of Evans, Bierly, Hutchison and Associates said Sporer was the only bidder on the project out of the five who took out plans. He said the bid is about \$18,000 under his estimate, and well within the limits of the Federal Aviation Administration, which will pay for 95 percent of the total project. The city portion will be about \$12,000. The project is expected to begin later this fall after review and approval from the government.

•Approved payment of \$139,117 for work completed by Miller Construction at Pioneer Park; \$10,803 to Evans, Bierly, Hutchison and

the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks for its walk-in hunting program. He says this will help pay for his retirement.

Unruh said some things are easier and others are harder now than when he started.

There are more programs to help farmers now, he said, loans are easier to get, and technology has provided some conveniences. But, he said, starting up a farm is probably harder now with costs being so

Now farmers can get federal crop insurance, Unruh said, disaster payments and assistance. They didn't have that until the 1970s, he said; now there's a bit more help if you

But the cost of things has gone up. "I bought a tractor for \$5,600," Unruh said. "Now they are about \$130,000 to \$150,000.

You get more of a tractor for that, he said. They have computers that tell how much plant population there is on each row, a buzzer to warn if anything is off and automa-
