

Lawyer attending court said 'Goodland will be a city' today in history

August 4, 1905: Goodland Will Be a City — Attorney L.W. Colby, while attending court here, said, "Goodland will be a city."

The conversation came about in this way. He said that a Mr. Wolfe, a fellow townsman living at Beatrice, Neb., and who has large land holdings in Rawlins, Cheyenne and Sherman counties, asked him where was the big coming town of western Kansas. He replied, "Goodland."

General Colby is a widely-traveled man and a shrewd observer of progress in the settlement of the great west.

August 5, 1905: Barber Shop Sold — Joe Cullins on Monday sold this barber shop business and fixtures to Charley Lull, recently from Lebanon, Kan. Possession was given as soon as the deal was closed. Cullins had been in the business in Goodland for several years and had made it pay. He moved into the present location of the shop over a year ago.

August 7, 1905: His 'Big' Speech Fell Flat — State Temperance Secretary is a Good Rambler — He Had a Good Enough Theme, But His Oratory Was Poor Stuff — The poorest temperance oration ever listened to by a Goodland audience was delivered at the Opera House by the Rev. W.L. Dexter. The churches gave up their services for the meeting; the audience was large.

It is too often true that when a preacher is nil in the ministry, they palm him off on an indulgent public as a temperance lecturer. The

people of Sherman County will always be glad to hear a good speech on temperance, but they are capable of being bored, like any other intelligent community.

August 8, 1905: Murphy Over the Joints — Appointed Assistant Attorney General — Injunctions Served on Four Places in Goodland — Says the Lid Will Be Kept On — E.F. Murphy, who was county attorney of Sherman County one term during 1903-04, but who lost out in his candidacy for re-election upon the issue of temperance, was appointed state assistant attorney for Sherman County.

The appointment of persons to this particular office, which course has been resorted to in a number of counties in the state to put the enforcement of the prohibitory law more directly in the hands of the state authorities, issues from the office of the attorney general of Kansas.

Governor Hoch promised the

temperance political wing of Kansas that he would enforce the prohibitory law, and the radical temperance element have not been slow in pushing the executive to a performance of his pledge. And so the governor has turned the attorney general into a "blacksnake," who in turn has begotten after his kind, to whip the jointists out of the liquor business in Kansas; and it looks as though Hock and his lieutenants are going to make it uncomfortable for the booze vender.

Mr. Murphy qualified for the office and when asked by a representative of this paper if he had sought the appointment, he replied that he had not.

"My duties have to do with the enforcement of the prohibitory laws of the state, and while I am not hunting trouble, I fully intend to stop the joint business in Goodland.

"The appointment of assistant attorney general has happened in counties only where there is an open and notorious violation of the liquor law, without due restraint from the county attorney.

"Experience in dealing with joints and saloons in Kansas seems

to show that the laying of the injunction is the most effective method. That form of procedure I have employed before and am now using the same in the present cases."

As assistant attorney general, Mr. Murphy has already had granted by Judge Smith, in chambers, Aug. 1, injunctions against the 10 persons in Goodland whom, it is charged, have been and are conducting joints or selling intoxicants contrary to the laws of Kansas.

The cases, in which injunctions were served Aug. 2, are as follows: The state of Kansas against John O. Dockerty and William Stewart; The state of Kansas against B.E. Coffin;

The State of Kansas against A.L. Cullins, Maud Cullins, Phillip Volker and H.W. Runnells; and The state of Kansas against Carrie Coler, Grace Sterling and Stella Burk.

While Attorney Murphy may not have sought his new office, there can be no doubt that he has it, and the people of Goodland and Sherman County will wait to see with what sincerity and effectiveness the program is carried out.
