

# Tee-Fore-Two takes over Sugar Hills

Sixty-two women from across Kansas came together at Sugar Hills Golf Club last week to compete in the 32nd annual Tee-Fore-Two golf tournament, the state championship of the Kansas Women's Golf Association.

The association has around 4,000 members belonging 163 clubs throughout Kansas. The tournament rotates among the state's 18-hole golf courses, and Sugar Hills was the venue nine years ago.

Thirty-one teams of two players each were divided into two flights. The tournament was played over three days, Thursday through Friday, consisting of 18 holes of four-ball stroke, 18 holes of Chapman, and 18 holes of scramble.

The grand low gross champion was the team of Jayne Clark of Hays and Terri Albers of Oakley, who shot a 213. The grand low net champion was the team of Terry Chesnut and Ann Burgess, both of Wichita, who scored 186.

In the first flight, Cindy Cooper of Tecumseh and Karen Exon of Topeka shot 221 for first low gross with Barbara Gourley and Linda Shostak, both of Manhattan, had a 223 for second low gross.

Janice Olick and Marcille Lewis, both of Wichita, defeated Myrna Tauton of Emporia and Robin Hanna of Winfield in a playoff for first low net after both teams finished with 188.

Juanita Hall of Dighton and Mary Gunter of Quinter teamed up to shoot a 255, ending up as the first low gross of the second flight. Linda Little of Derby and Sharon Phillips of Wichita shot a 257 for the second low gross.

Tammy Neal of Goodland teamed with Joan Jamison of Brewster to score a 187 for the second flight's first

low net with Joyce McCabe of Emporia and Sharon Hamrick of Wichita

scoring a 188 for second low net. Goodland's Ramona Livengood

teamed up with Marsha Johnson of Sharon Springs to shoot a 288 gross

(196 net), and the Goodland team of Marsha McGillivray and Mona McGinley scored a 296 gross (199 net). Both were in the second flight.

## Colby Trojans adds height to men's basketball team

The Colby Community College men's basketball team has gained some height to go along with its new coach for the upcoming season.

Joining the Trojan roster this November are Luis Angolo, a 7-foot center from Colombia, and Andrew Marshall, a 6-foot 10-inch post from England.

First-year coach John Woods said he expects Angolo to be the team's leading rebounder.

"Luis is a strong presence around the basket who can play defense and run the floor like a guard," Woods said. "Andrew is also a strong post player whose talents will show in the half-court game. He really knows how to pass the ball and is a good shooter from the high post."

Another newcomer to the team this year is Hellion "Boogie" Knight, a transfer from Western Wyoming College, whom Woods said brings leadership skills and experience to Colby.

Other incoming freshman include 6-foot, 6-inch guard Camilo Londono, who also comes from Colombia, and Curt Field, a 6-foot, 2-inch guard from Dodge City. Others who have signed to play

for the Trojans next season include two players from Louisiana: Micah Hagans of Kenner and Justin Brown of New Orleans. Maurice Bethea of Barstow, Calif., also joins the team this fall as will another player from Colombia, John Velez Ortiz.

"I am looking forward to introducing our players to the community," said Woods. "I believe we have recruited exceptional student-athletes who will be good representatives for our school, both on and off the court."

Woods enters his first season as coach after spending last season as an assistant to Brian Marso, who

resigned in April to coach at Garden City Community College. Before that, Woods was the coach at Western Wyoming for six seasons.

Woods is a graduate of the University of Wyoming, where he served two seasons as a graduate assistant on the Cowboys' coaching staff. After that, he was an assistant coach at Casper College for a year.

The Trojans ended last season 15-15 overall and finished 6-10 in the West Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

Two players returning from last season's squad are Nate Bowie and Sidney Birdsong. Bowie started several

games last year, averaging over 10 points per game, and led the team in free throw shooting. Birdsong saw limited action playing in 21 of 30 games.

The annual Colby Community College Men's Basketball Golf Tournament is scheduled for Friday, Aug. 19, at the Colby Country Club. The four-player scramble will begin with registration at 8 a.m. Mountain Time and a "shotgun" start at 9. The cost is \$65 per player or \$250 per team.

A social hour follows the tournament, starting at 4 p.m., with a benefit auction beginning 30 minutes later.

## Goodland wins radio golf classic

The Goodland team stopped Norton's win streak at three at the 16th annual KLOE-KKCI-KWGB Classic Golf Tournament held July 31 at Sugar Hills Golf Club.
