The Goodland Star-News Coaching three sports in high school isn't unheard of in Kansas, especially in Class 4A and smaller schools. What's rare is being successful in all three.

That is what Jon McLean did last year, leading both the Cowboys football and basketball teams to McLean said, was the best the Cowpost-season play, and sending two golfers to the state tournament.

Now the coach says he's not only ready do it all again, but determined to improve on last year's results in all three sports.

They swept District 15, winning all three games, then went on to win their first two playoff games before losing to Rose Hill High in the state semi-finals.

This past basketball season, boys had in his six years as their coach. After going 14-8 in 2002-2003, Goodland fell to 8-13 the next season. Rising to another challenge, he helped the team turn things around in 2004-2005, finishing the season 15-6, including a perfect 7-
